Cabinet approves PPP bill

The weekly Cabinet meeting yesterday approved in principle a draft of "Public-Private-Partnership Bill, 2013" to promote private sector investment in the country's development.

"The Prime Minister's Office (PMO) placed the draft to give the existing public-private partnership (PPP) policy a legal shape," said Cabinet Secretary Musharraf Hossain Bhuiyan.

He was talking to journalists after the Cabinet meeting, chaired by Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, at Bangladesh Secretariat.

He said the bill has the scope for accepting unsolicited proposals. "It defines various terms and conditions for processes on, among others, negotiations, determining private partners, and cancelling and extending agreements." Musharraf said a PPP office would be set up once the law




