












# 1.5 lakh prepaid electricity meters in capital, N'ganj soon

Ecnec approves project

The government is going to introduce around 1.5 lakh prepaid electricity meters in the capital and Narayanganj to improve the quality of customer service and to stop revenue evasion.

The Executive Committee of the National Economic Council (Ecnec) yesterday approved the Tk 173 crore project for installing and operating the meters at Lalbagh, Bashabo, Maniknagar, Bangshal, Jurain and east Narayanganj. A planning ministry statement yesterday said the meters

would be installed under a pilot project of Dhaka Power Distribution Company which would be completed by December 2015.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina presided over the Ecnec meeting at National Economic Council conference room.

The Ecnec also okayed a Tk 1,658 crore project aiming at reforming secondary education sector.

# Low income group hit hard during hartal in Ctg

People of Chittagong city living on daily earnings fare the worst during hartals as the

shutdowns threaten their livelihood. Transport workers, small roadside shop owners, hawkers and street vendors make the bulk of these people who are hit hard

during hartals. Md Rafique, owner of a small roadside tea stall at Prabartak Intersection, told this correspondent that he was struggling to earn his living due to hartals.

Rafique said his sales had declined significantly yesterday, the last day of the 60hour shutdown enforced by the BNP-led 18party alliance.

Till 11:30am yesterday, he earned about Tk 400, while his usual earnings by that time range from Tk 800 to Tk 1,000, said

Rafique. Rafique, whose six-member family is

dependent on him, said he has no alterna-

tive means of earning a livelihood.

A cobbler at the city's No. 2 Gate area, Kabir Babu, said while his income is usually between Tk 200 to Tk 300 per day, during hartals he struggles to earn Tk 100

Babu said it is very difficult to earn his livelihood as it is; shutdowns increase his sufferings immeasurably.

Like Rafique and Babu, thousands of people, who go by using their daily income, suffer extremely during shutdowns.

According to Masud Rana, general secretary of Chittagong Sammilto Hawkers Federation, there are around 17,000 hawkers in Chittagong city. Their sales decline significantly during hartals, he added.

Abul Kalam Azad, secretary general of Chittagong Zilla Sarak Paribahan Malik Group, said over 50,000 transport workers in greater Chittagong lost their daily income during the 60-hour shutdown.

# Ruet registrar removed

Procedural violation alleged

Registrar of the Rajshahi University of Engineering and Technology (Ruet) Abul Basar was removed on Monday.

Basar and some current and former syndicate members, however, said the removal violated the university rules, as the syndicate did not sit to take the decision.

Talking to The Daily Star, Vice Chancellor Prof Morttuza Ali cited the reasons as Basar's "negligence in duty and noncompliance with official orders.'

Basar said he was removed without the approval of the syndicate, which is required to sit before making such decisions as per rules.

In this regard, a letter signed by the vice chancellor was issued on Monday, saying the registrar was removed upon the decision of the syndicate though no syndicate meeting took place before his removal. The letter also does not cite any reason of the removal.

Wishing anonymity, a former syndicate member told The Daily Star, "It's a violation of the university act to remove the registrar without holding a syndicate meeting."

Abul Basar, whose three-year tenure began in April 2011 and is supposed to end in February 2014, alleged that he was removed for refusing to support the VC's orders over "appointment of
