### Brief gunfight near US embassy in Yemen

A gun battle broke out on Monday near the US embassy in Yemen's capital, but the situation was rapidly brought under control, security sources and witnesses said.

The clash took place around a kilometre (0.6 miles) west of the US mission in Sanaa, a security official said, in an area with a strong presence of security forces. However, another security official said the area

borders on the Musaik neighbourhood in central Sanaa, where dormant cells of Al-Qaeda are believed to be based. Security sources said the shooting had nothing

to do with the US mission, and local residents said the situation was back to normal. The US embassy and several Western missions

closed in August after US warnings of an Al-Qaeda attack.

Al-Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula (AQAP) has intensified its attacks on security forces in Yemen, taking advantage of the weakening of the Sanaa central government since a popular uprising that toppled president Ali Abdullah Saleh in 2011.

The trial was held at the court set up at a makeshift building at Bakshibazar in Old Dhaka. During the trial, the court recorded statements of 654 people out of 1345 prosecution witnesses.

one has showed up and offered me a job since Sunday -- not even for an hour," he sighed. Day labourer Adom Ali came to Dhaka from

village, as it is really hard to earn money during hartals," he noted. Both he and Mahbub are of the view that

# Indian home minister says Centre alerted Bihar

India's central government yesterday said it had alerted the Bihar government about possible terror attack on BJP Prime Ministerial candidate Narendra Modi's rally in Patna which was rocked by serial blasts on Sunday.

"We have said that we had given input security. The home minister, who was (about Patna rally). Now, it was general or specific input that is a different thing. Whenever there is specific input we give but whenever there are such rallies we give input saying you have rally in your state so there could be a possibility of an attack," he told reporters. He was replying to a question whether the Central government had alerted the Bihar government beforehand about possible terror attack on Modi's rally. Multiple blasts rocked in and around the rally venue in Patna on Sunday claiming six lives and injuring more than 80 people. "We

give input saying you could be attacked in 2-3 days or so and so day. We keep doing that. We also give specific input," he said on the sidelines of a function organized on the occasion of the 74th raising day of CRPF. Shinde said the home ministry had given
