Rain or thundershower is likely to occur over Rajshahi, Dhaka and Sylhet divisions and the region of Comilla till 6:00pm today.

Weather may remain mainly dry with temporary partly cloudy sky elsewhere over the country, Met Office said.

Light to moderate fog may occur at places over

Rajshahi, Rangpur, Dhaka, and Sylhet divisions during late night till this morning.

Day and night temperature may remain nearly unchanged over the country.

The sun sets in the capital today at 5:17pm and rises tomorrow at 6:08am.

HARTAL EVE VIOLENCE 2013

1) A crude bomb explodes near a private car in the capital's Uttara on November 3, the day before the BNP-led opposition alliance's 60-hour harta. Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal activists hurled it before fleeing the scene. 2) A man soaked in blood lies unconscious following a blast in Katabon area. 3) Eakator TV journalist Zakaria Biplob being treated in United Hospital for wounded legs. He came under a bomb attack in front of his office on October 26 before the opposition's first 60-hour harta that began the next day. 4) The inside of a burnt bus in Farmgate. 5) A picket hurling a big chunk of concrete at a private car in Bijoynagar area. 6) In Dhaka Medical College Hospital, a mother comforts a human hauler driver burned in a cocktail explosion in Mohammadpur. 7) A scared woman with her school-going daughter strides past a burning car on Jubilee Road in Chittagong city on September 17, the day preceding Jamaat-e-Islami's 48-hour countrywide shutdown. 8) A blazing microbus of ATN News set alight by BNP activists before the party's Nayapaltan office in the capital on April 1, another day preceding a countrywide dawn-to-dusk harta of the 18-party opposition alliance and Islami Chhatra Shibir. 9) Nearby, another car was torched simultaneously. 10) That day, these two buses were set afire in Khuila city's Ferryghat Bus Stand. 11) Hawkers try to save their goods as pickets torched this bus in Farmgate of the capital on March 27, the first day of the alliance's 36-hour countrywide shutdown. 12) Pickets hurl brick chips at police, not in picture, after setting alight a poor street vendor's cart in Nayapaltan on March 11, the day before BNP's daylong harta. 13) An express train burns at Rajshahi Railway Station on March 2, preceding a three-day Jamaat harta.
