Monir, the 14-year-old boy set on fire by pickets during the opposition's hartal on Monday, has gone beyond all pains and sufferings.


He died an agonising death at Dhaka Medical




## Hasina, Khaleda open to Ashraf-Fakhrul talks

But both leaders keep trading salvos; EU urges BNP not to boycott polls

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and opposition leader Khaleda Zia yesterday once again traded blame for their failure to sit in a dialogue, with business leaders and foreign diplomats renewing their calls for resolving the crisis through talks.

Speaking at separate rallies, the Awami League and the BNP chiefs yesterday accused each other, referring to their recent telephone conversation. During the 37-minute conversation on October 27,

they could not agree on a date for talks.

But still, the two leaders yesterday spoke in favour of a secretary general-level dialogue.

"Today, I am saying that we are still waiting to have a secretary general-level dialogue between the two parties as proposed by the businessmen," Khaleda said yesterday.

When business leaders met Hasina yesterday, she assured them of holding an unconditional secretary general-level discussion.
