Brazilian-born striker Diego Costa has been called-up to Vicente del Bosque's Spain squad for the friendly matches against Equatorial

Guinea and South Africa later this month. The Atletico Madrid man declared his intention to play for Spain, for whom he qualifies on residency grounds, and rejected a call-up from Brazil boss Luiz Felipe Scolari

Costa has scored 16 times in as many games this season, including on Wednesday night as Los Rojiblancos secured their place in the last 16 of the Champions League with a 4-0 thrashing of Austria Vienna.

"Every player offers distinct things. Diego fulfils all the criteria to play for Spain as he is in great form," said Del Bosque.

"We still have seven months until the World Cup and he is another option that we wanted to try in these two friendlies."

Del Bosque had previously been quoted as saying that should he call on Costa he would be "almost obliged" to take him to the World Cup.

However, he insists that despite turning his back on Brazil to play for the world champions, he will be judged just like any other player.

"We saw that he could play and we have incorporated him after a logical process.

"It all began in September and he fulfilled all the requirements. We got to know him personally and he gave us a strong feeling.

Defoe fires Spurs

Jermain Defoe broke Tottenham's European goalscoring record on Thursday as he steered his side into the knockout phase of the Europa League with a tough 2-1 victory over Moldova's Sheriff Tiraspol.

Spurs join Valencia, Salzburg, Esbjerg, Fiorentina and Dninpro in the last-32 who all booked their places with two matches still remaining in the group phase.

Defoe's clinical 67th minute penalty, which not only makes him the competition's top scorer with five goals from four matches, also gave him 23 European goals, one more than former England international Martin Chivers.

Chivers, who scored 13 goals in 24 matches for England, helped the side win the same competition in 1972 when it was known as the UEFA Cup.

Valencia, who won the tournament in 2004 and were twice beaten Champions League finalists, are also into the next round after a Sergio Canales' goal five minutes

from time gave them a 3-2 victory at Swiss side St Gallen.

Premier League club Swansea blew a victory chance against Kuban Krasnodar for the second time when they conceded a lastgasp equaliser but need only avoid defeat when they play St Gallen in their final game or beat Valencia at home in their next to ensure their passage to the knock-out stages.

Despite playing the last quarter of an hour with 10-men following defender Xandao's red card at the Kuban Stadium, the Russians netted two minutes into injury time through Ibrahima Balde to earn a 1-1 draw.

Ivory Coast forward Wilfried Bony had given the Welsh visitors an early lead but just as Djibril Cisse's penalty at the Liberty Stadium had cost them a win last month, so too this time Senegal forward Balde's clever lofted finish broke Swans' hearts.

Fiorentina, who lost the 1990 final against Serie A rivals Juventus, continued their progress by making it four wins out of four with two goals in the last four minutes from Ryder Matos and Borja Valero which gave them a 2-1 win at Romanians Pandurii

Dale Steyn returned his best one-day bowling figures while opener Quinton de Kock hit a maiden hundred as South Africa beat Pakistan by 28 runs in the fourth day-night international in Abu Dhabi on Friday. The win gave them an unassailable 3-1 lead in the five-match series

ahead of the fifth and final match in Sharjah on Monday. Steyn (5-25) derailed Pakistan in the 47th over with the wickets of Umar Akmal (22), captain Misbah-ul Haq (65 and Saeed Ajmal (0) to wreck the opposition from 228-5 to 238 all out in 49.2 overs. South Africa's

With Misbah and Umar at the crease, and with 41 needed in five overs, Pakistan looked set to level the series but Steyn improved on his previous best of 5-50 against India at Nagpur in 2011 to help South Africa snatch an unexpected win.

Misbah, along with debutant Sohaib Magsood (56), put Pakistan in charge but Steyn removed Maqsood in the 37th over to give his team a sniff of the victory. When Misbah holed out, after hitting four boundaries and a six off 76 balls, Pakistan's hopes were suddenly dashed.

Pakistan had raced to 74 without loss in a cautious start before they lost three wickets in the space of 12 runs.

In the 19th over, Ahmed Shehzad was run out and it became 85-2 when leg-spinner Imran Tahir bowled Mohammad Hafeez (33). A run later Asad Shafiq miscued a drive and was caught off paceman Lonwabo Tsotsobe.

Earlier, after South Africa won the toss, de Kock anchored the South African innings. The 20-year-old left-hander made the most of a dropped catch at slip by Hafeez off Tanvir when he had made only two. He went on to make a 135-ball 112 with nine boundaries and a six.

Ryan McLaren (28) and Jean-Paul Duminy (25) added a quickfire 52 for the unbroken sixth wicket stand, hitting two sixes off Saeed Ajmal's 49th over.
