Bangladesh fifth most vulnerable in 2 decades

Says new CRI report

Bangladesh has ranked fifth among 10 countries most vulnerable to climate change-induced natural disasters in the last two decades from 1993 to 2012, according to a new report.

During the period, Bangladesh suffered damages worth US\$1,832.70 million, wrought by 242 types of natural catastrophes, states the Climate Risk Index (CRI) 2014.

Germanwatch, a German based non-profit research organisation, prepared the report with the assistance of Munich Re Foundation, another German-based organisation, ahead of

the the UN climate conference 2013, which kicked off Monday at Warsaw, Poland.

Haiti, the Philippines, and Pakistan are the three countries most affected in 2012. In the report, Germanwatch asked the

international community to make the Warsaw climate talks a turning point by starting immediately to reinforce its efforts in addressing climate change and the consequential losses, which are increasing.

The CRI report says, "The COP19 must make commitments towards establishing a consolidated international response for instance in the form of a mechanism."






