It was a huge turnaround for Mexico, who barely made it to the play-off after struggling in their North and Central America and Caribbean regional group, finishing fourth out of six teams.

# SACHINIS Bangladeshi affair

Bangladesh was still a cricketing backwater then, in 1998. As far as live cricket goes, cricket fans had to be content with the domestic leagues while watching international matches on cable television, a modern advent that was only four or five years old. Then at the turn of the year the country hosted India and Pakistan for a tri-series, the Independence Cup, in which Bangladesh were the third team.

From then began a scarcely documented love story with Indian batting superstar Sachin Tendulkar. As 1998 dawned, Tendulkar was a scarred cricketer. Two years ago he had carried all before him in a World Cup at home which ended in heartbreak. He was then made captain and presided over a period of crushing failures on tours to South Africa and the West Indies.

These failures left a proud cricketer jaded. But all that changed as the captaincy changed hands and Tendulkar embarked upon his first tournament as just a player at the Bangabandhu National Stadium, then Bangladesh's home of cricket.

He started sedately with a 76-ball 54 against Bangladesh in the opener. But it was against archrivals Pakistan that he truly shed the burden that had weighed him down over the previous two years and went on all-out attack. A 44-ball 67 in the round-robin stage was followed by a 78-ball 95 in the first of three finals.

With Tendulkar failing in the second final, India unsurprisingly lost. In the third, however, faced with a stiff target of 315, Tendulkar kick-started a record chase with a 26-ball 41. His stint in Bangladesh in early 1998 was a new beginning for Tendulkar as he became a more aggressive batsman since that tournament -- his average and strike rate before Dhaka '98 was 38.63 and 82.51 respectively, and have been 48.43 and 88.07 since. Whereas previously he would seek to play himself in at

the top of the order, he now sought to take the attack to the bowlers early, as if fed up with the undue burden of being the country's sole hope.

Before his assault on Shane Warne later that year came his assault on Aaquib Javed and the best off-spinner in the world -- Saqlain Mushtaq -- in Dhaka. There was speculation over how Tendulkar would deal with the doosra specialist, but he ended all that by dancing down the pitch and smiting Saqlain's first ball over long-off in the third final. Tendulkar also started playing his most nakedly aggressive shot -- the downthe-wicket, straight-batted deposition of a fast bowler's offering over the sightscreen -with much more regularity from Dhaka '98. Before Michael Kasprowicz, Damien Fleming or Glenn McGrath had reasons to complain, Aaquib Javed was standing with hands on hips after being consummately dismissed by the Indian maestro.

The love affair continued over the years. Later that year he stroked a sublime 141 and took four wickets to singlehandedly dump Australia from the ICC Mini World Cup. In 16 ODIs in the country, Tendulkar scored two hundreds and five fifties at an average of 51.68. In seven Tests here, he scored five centuries

and finished with an average of 136.66. But those who were there will most remember Tendulkar's Dhaka sojourn in 1998. It launched his annus mirabilis, a year where he left the rest of the world in the lurch by stroking nine centuries in ODIs and three in Tests. Like any love affair, there were struggles that wore off some of the gloss, such as his laboured, long-awaited 100th international ton, coming against Bangladesh in Mirpur in March 2012, one that ended in defeat. That was the last of his ODI tons, but in Dhaka he became immortal after starting his journey to god-like status in the city 14 years ago. It was a fitting and beautiful end to a story as Bangladesh witnessed cricketing history and also

enjoyed a famous win.

# Por-Swe tops the billing

The battle for the final four European places for the 2014 World Cup finals get underway on Friday with France and Portugal battling to join the likes of fellow continental heavyweights holders Spain and Germany in Brazil.

Portugal, led by superstar Cristiano Ronaldo, have the toughest play-off as they face Sweden, who have their own icon in Zlatan Ibrahimovic leading their line.

Former champions France travel to Kiev to play Ukraine and will be hoping if they qualify it will not be in the controversial manner they did for the 2010 finals where the decisive goal against Ireland in their play-off was set up by Thierry Henry's infamous handball.

The other two play-offs pit goal shy Greece against Romania while the fairytale could be provided by Iceland, bidding to become the smallest country to ever qualify for the finals, as they host 1998 semifinalists Croatia. Many neutrals are disappointed that one of Ronaldo or

Ibrahimovic will miss out on Brazil, but the PSG striker says his team deserve their place in the hat when the World Cup finals draw takes place on December 6 at Mata de Sao Joao.

"We have had tough matches during qualification but this has only stimulated us," said Ibrahimoivic.

"Portugal are probably favourites given their team and their individuals, but we came second in a group featuring Germany and we deserve to go to Brazil more." added the Sweden skipper.
