# Hasina leans on JP for 'credible' polls

8 new ministers take oath; job distribution, fate of old ones to be disclosed today

The prime minister yesterday inducted five Jatiya Party leaders into her cabinet and appointed another as her adviser, in a clear manifestation of banking on former military dictator Ershad's party to overcome the crisis centring on the election.

Through this, Sheikh Hasina has begun forming the polls-time government that has eight members

Two of the other three are from the Awami League and one from the Workers Party.

Earlier in the day, the JP quit the AL-led grand alliance and announced that it would contest the general election independently.

Asked to comment on the development, an AL presidium member termed it most natural. "Nothing has happened out of the blue. What has happened was to happen."

The new ministers, however, were not given their portfolios because the process of forming the pollstime cabinet is not over yet. Hasina has yet to finalise the names of ministers who will remain in the SEE PAGE 10 COL 1

US official stresses urgency as polls-time cabinet formed

: US Assistant Secretary of State Nisha Desai Biswal sees talks as an even more urgent priority now that an interim cabinet has been announced.

"The announcement of interim cabinet simply underscores the urgency for a dialogue to take place immediately to determine the way forward for peaceful, free, fair and credible election," she said at a pre-departure press conference.

Biswal said the United States would like to see a peaceful and fair election in · Bangladesh. For that, it will work with the United Nations and the international community and lend support in whatever way it could.

## 2 killed in Gazipur as RMG workers clash with cops

Two garment workers were killed and at least 50 injured in a clash between workers and cops at Kashimpur of Gazipur yesterday afternoon.

The dead are Badsha Mia, 25, and Ruma Akter, 22, of GMS Composite Knitting Industries Ltd in Sardaganj of Kashimpur industrial belt.

The clash ensued when several thousand workers went berserk at the factory after a factory official allegedly beat up a female worker.

Meanwhile, labour unrest continued yesterday in Ashulia and Savar over the minimum wage as garment workers took to the streets and clashed with police, leaving at least 52 people injured.

Over 100 garment factories in the area suspended their production for the day.

#### **GAZIPUR**

Witnesses said a production manager of GMS Composite beat up the female worker of the sewing section around 12:30pm, prompting demonstrations by fellow workers at the factory.

#### BNF gets EC registration

The Election Commission has finally registered the much-talked-about political party Bangladesh Nationalist Front and gave it "television" as its electoral symbol.

"As the party has fulfilled all the requirements, we have registered it. I think there will be no more debate on the party's registration because its symbol does not look similar to any other party's electoral symbol," Election Commissioner Shah Nawaz told reporters.

BNF applied to the commission for registration in October last year, and it was initially selected by the commission a few months later. But the party came under criticism after it sought "sheaf of wheat" as its symbol, which many believed could be confused
