## Dhaka decided in principle to sign Ticfa

New foreign minister tells journalists

UNB, Dhaka

New Foreign Minister Abul Hasan Mahmud Ali yesterday said Dhaka and Washington would sign the Trade and Investment Cooperation Forum Agreement (Ticfa) as the decision was taken in principle earlier.

"Let's see...still we've time," he told journalists after a marathon meeting with his colleagues a day after getting his portfolio.

Earlier in parliament, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina said ministers of the election-time government would not make any policy decisions, rather would only be doing routine works.

Commerce Secretary Mahbub Ahmed and acting deputy of US Trade Representative Wendy Cutler is scheduled to sign the deal on behalf of their respective sides on November 25.

Asked on the government's position if India agrees to sign the Teesta deal on December 15, a smiling Abul Hasan said, "We say in English we'll cross that bridge when we'll come near to it. Time will say how we'll cross that bridge. Future will answer your ques-

He said there has been a significant progress in Bangladesh over nearly the last five years and in many indexes Bangladesh is well ahead of many countries, including the biggest and friendly neighbour India.

Each worker had to spend only Tk 33,500 while the recruiting agencies would have charged a minimum Tk 2.5 lakh to Tk 3 lakh, said the Bureau of Manpower, Employment and Training officials.

Central Asian Affairs Nisha Desai Biswal during her swearing-in ceremony at George Marshall East Auditorium in the State Department, Washington, DC on Thursday. According to the US, the creation of the corridor, linking

the economies of India, Bangladesh, and Southeast Asia,

holds great promise for greater trade and cooperation throughout the region. Nisha, who visited Bangladesh on November 16-18, had a range of meetings with top leaders, including Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and opposition leader Khaleda Zia,

and urged a dialogue to hold a free, fair, credible, and inclusive election. In his speech, US Secretary of State John Kerry, who administered the oath, lauded Nisha, saying that during her visit to Bangladesh, she showed how she never missed a

chance to speak up or stand up for America's values. "She spoke forcefully about the need for leaders to rise above partisan differences and find a peaceful way towards the ballot box."

Kerry said the countries Nisha was going to represent were complicated and had been going through enormous challenges. "America's prosperity rests more than ever in the strength of our links to this region," he added. Kerry also said, "Nisha's experience and the success that

so many Indian Americans bring to the American table shows to everybody in the world the deep ties that we have between the United States and India." For the first time, five out of the six regional assistant

secretaries of state are women. Nisha is the first South Asian to lead the key bureau of US State Department.




