Expressing astonishment at the Election Commission's plan to deploy army way ahead of the 10th general poll Shushashoner Jannoy Nagorik (SHUJAN) Secretary Badiul Alam Majumdar yesterday said it might create controversy over the force's impartiality.

Passengers suffer for schedule collapse, cancellation of trips

Hundreds of passengers suffered long waits at Chittagong · Railway Station yesterday, as most trains ran behind schedules and some trips were cancelled due to broken rail tracks and violence during the opposition's country-wide blockade.

Till 6:00pm yesterday, trips of three Dhaka-bound intercity trains were cancelled due to delayed arrivals or on secu-rity grounds, said railway officials.

Because of this, the passengers of Karnaphuli Express, Suborno Express and Mohanagar Probhati had to leave the station after hours of tiresome wait.

The trips of Suborno and Probhati were cancelled, as they were stranded at different stations, said Chittagong Railway Station Manger AA Shamsul Alam.

Only Sagorika Express, one of the 13 mail, express and · intercity trains which ply between Chittagong and other · districts everyday, started off on time.

Talking to The Daily Star around 11:30am, Shah Alam, a · passenger of Paharika Express, which was scheduled to leave at 8:30am, said he had been waiting since 7:30am.

Drug Price Hike by Nearly 50 Percent Pharmaceuticals using

political violence as diversion

Janashastha Sangram Parishad rally told

Taking advantage of the distraction created by the political violence, profiteering pharmaceutical companies have arbitrarily increased prices of many widely used lifesaving drugs significantly, hoping that it would go unnoticed, speakers told a protest rally yesterday.

The recent hike, nearly 50 percent, affected antiulcerants, antibiotics, muscle relaxants and bronchodilators but the government could not care less about the burden of overpriced drugs on people because it is busy preparing itself for the one-sided election, they said.

The rally was organised by Janashastha Sangram Parishad (JSP), a citizens' forum to protect health rights, before the capital's Jatiya Press Club. People are being held hostage to the whims of the syndi-

cate of a few pharmaceutical companies while the government bodies tasked with reining in the prices are doing nothing, they said. The Directorate General of Drug Administration, the

government body to control prices and quality of drugs, claims that they have no control over the matter, said JSP Convener Dr Faizul Alam Lala. "The people will soon control the prices through organis-

ing a mass movement," he said. "Although the two parties disagree with each other on most issues, they seem to be on the same boat regarding the prices of medication," said Razekuzzaman Ratan, central SEE PAGE 4 COL 6
