Hindu houses, shops looted

12 hurt in attack by 'Jamaat men' in Lalmonirhat

Hindus came under attack allegedly by activists of Jamaat-e-Islami and Islami Chhatra Shibir at Patgram upazila in Lalmonirhat for the second time in a month yesterday.

The attackers beat up at least 12 women and children and torched and looted at least five shops and two houses at Ghoshpara village of Jongra union on the third day of the opposition-sponsored 71-hour blockade.

The incident fuelled concerns over a fresh spell of attacks on the Hindus as men of the village have fled in fear of further attacks.

Earlier on October 28, Jamaat-Shibir men along with BNP activists unleashed a terror on another Hindu majority area at Shafinagar in Bawra union during hartal, torching at least 18 shops.

Bad days for the poor

Working class feels the pinch of blockade

Street violence during the last 71-hour blockade could not prevent the working classes from coming out of their homes on account of necessity. They had a choice between staying at home in fear and starving or going out to earn their living. They chose the latter.

Many bus and CNG-run auto-rickshaw drivers, labourers and passersby fell victim to arson attacks, vandalism and explosions by pro-blockade activists but that hardly

lessened the desperation of the working class people.

Talking to The Daily Star, day labourers, commuter bus drivers and conductors said they knew they might become victims of the mindless violence anytime but they had to risk their lives to feed themselves and their families.

"Everybody has a fear of losing life; so do I. I don't want to drive in such a situation but there is no alternative," said Rafiqul Islam, 35, driver of a commuter bus on the Gabtali-
