# Grave mistake Railway seeks BGB hurts boy who thought it to be a ball help for security

The Bangladesh Railway seeks support from Bangladesh Ansar and paramilitary Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) to guard its infrastructure as growing attacks on its network by blockaders threaten rail communications.

Some 2,528 Ansar personnel had already been deployed at 632 risky points, said railway officials. They added BGB jawans would also be deployed if the attacks continued.

Railway has a 1,600-member Government Railway Police (GRP) force and 1,949-member Railway Nirapatta Bahini (RNB). But the number is not adequate to guard the vast network that includes 2,835-kilometre tracks and 456 stations.

## It's hard to cope with patients

Each hartal and blockade over the last month brought with it more arson victims at the burn unit of Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

The latest of them were 19 people, who were burnt on Thursday evening after a bus was set alight by pickets at Shahbagh. Two of the victims succumbed to their injuries on Friday.


Overwhelmed by the influx of patients to the hospital, the DMCH yesterday formed an 11-member medical board at the burn unit to deal with the workload.

The board, headed by DMCH Director Dr Deen Mohammad, consisted of specialists from ophthalmology, medicine, anaesthesia, surgery, burn and blood transfusion departments, among others, veteran burn expert Dr Samanto Lal Sen told The Daily Star.
