



Harsh blow to vendors

Blockade cuts sales

Street vendors at the entrance and exit points of the capital face a harsh blow during blockades as the number of their customers, mainly inter-district passengers, drops significantly.

On a regular day, thousands of people use five main roads, rail and waterway to enter and leave Dhaka. But the points were seen virtually empty yesterday, the second day of the latest 72-hour blockade, with very few passengers, fewer vehicles and closed counters.

Abu Taher, 42, was selling newspapers at Gabtoli bus terminal that linked the capital with northern and southern parts of the country.

Taher said he usually sold more than 150 copies of daily

newspapers on a regular day, but his sale hardly hit 50 in the afternoon yesterday. "There have been almost no passengers here during the

ast two days. I have lost almost the entire day," he said. According to Bangladesh Hawkers Federation, there are

around 2.6 lakh vendors in the city who do businesses on footpaths and other places. Of them, 40 percent cannot run their businesses during agitations like hartal and blockade. Those who dare to continue in such a hostile situation

Govt opens probe into Standard Group fire

The government yesterday formed a high-level investigation committee to find out the reasons behind the fire at a Standard Group factory on Friday.

The nine-member committee comprises members of different intelligence agencies and will be headed by Main Uddin Khandaker, additional secretary to the home ministry. The committee will submit its report in seven days.

"It was an act of sabotage. The committee will find out who were behind the fire," Labour Secretary Mikail Shipar said.

The arsonists wanted to dent the image of Bangladeshi garment industries abroad, Shipar said. SEE PAGE 10 COL 1

Food courts are finally going to be functional as the government has recently cleared the way for judicial magistrates to run the courts at each district and metropolitan city to check food adulteration.

These courts are meant for dealing with the cases filed in connection with adultera-

tion of food items to relieve consumers across the country of worries.

This court can fine anyone up to Tk 3 lakh for food adulteration and sentence him or her to three years' rigorous imprisonment as per the relevant law.

The law ministry issued a gazette notification on November 20, asking the judicial

Violence shakes Thai capital

4 killed as anti-govt protests spread

AFP, Bangkok

Thai police yesterday fired tear gas and water cannon at protesters trying to storm the government headquarters to overthrow Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra, after violence in the capital left four dead and dozens wounded.

The bloodshed is the latest in a series of outbreaks of civil strife in the kingdom since royalist generals ousted billionaire tycoon-turned-premier Thaksin Shinawatra, Yingluck's brother, seven years ago.


