

BNS Somudra Joy arrives from US

BNS Somudra Joy, the newest member of Bangladesh Navy's fleet, arrived at Chittagong port yesterday.

Formerly, the United States Coast Guard (USCG) Cutter Jarvis, the 378-foot high endurance cutter was commissioned in Hawaii in 1972 and is now the largest vessel in the Bangladesh Navy inventory, said a US Embassy press release.

The ship was transferred to the Bangladesh Navy under the Excess Defense Articles programme in May, and after an extensive programme for training and new equipment installation in California, the 167-man crew has successfully conducted a six-week

transit of the Pacific Ocean. Responding to the disaster in the Philippines, the Bangladesh Navy was able
