Govt moves to bring Satkhira under control

After 24 days of violence and killings virtually turned Satkhira into a valley of terror, · law enforcers finally initiated a drive against Jamaat-e-Islami and pro-Jamaat student organisation Islami Chhatra Shibir, arresting 16 activists Saturday night. The 16 were preparing to board a Dhaka-

bound bus when police and Bangladesh Border Guard (BGB), acting on a tip off, conducted a drive to make the arrests at a ticket counter in Kolaroa upazila. Four of them were involved in killing an

Awami League (AL) activist last week while the rest in attacking police and felling trees to block roads, police said.

Though the offences were committed · in Kolaroa, the 16 have been kept at Satkhira Sadar Police Station due to secu-: rity concerns.

Terming it a major success, Kolaroa Dara Khan said three cases have been filed against 380 people over the killing of three AL, Jubo League and Swechhasebak League leaders since November 26.

At least 13 persons, including nine AL and associate organisation leaders, have been killed in the southern district, a stronghold of Jamaat, since November 21

during hartals and blockades enforced by the BNP-Jamaat-led 18-party opposition alliance.

Jamaat-Shibir activists has been felling trees and digging up the district's four major roads, nearly cutting it off from the rest of the country. They even attacked police and BGB trying to make the road suitable for traffic.

Five Shibir men held in Dhaka, Faridpur

Police arrested two alleged activists of Islami Chhatra Shibir with a huge amount of explosives and Jihadi books in the capital's Kallyanpur yesterday morning.

The arrestees are Khalid and his brother Sajid. Mirpur police said on information, they raided the building on road no-2 where the two resided in a garret and recovered six kilograms of explosives, three sacks of bomb making materials, seven live crude bombs and some "Shibir" marked T-shirts.

The books included one named "Porokaler Passport" (Passport to the Day of Judgment).

Meanwhile in Faridpur, police arrested three Shibir activists -- Chowdhury Mohsinuzzaman, Rakibul Islam and Nakibul Islam -- and recovered 19 petrol bombs, six crude bombs, and many Jihadi books from their possessions at Shantibagh intersection.

Hijackers hack auto-rickshaw driver to death in Ashulia


