

Five people were killed and 12 others injured in separate road accidents across the country

yesterday and Sunday. Our Dinajpur correspondent reports, a girl was killed and her father injured when a truck hit the motorbike carrying them near Provat Kindergarten School in Kaharol upazila yesterday.

The deceased was Ayreen Akhter, 6, daughter of Abdur Razzak of Bolorampur village.

Meanwhile at Hazirmor, Farhana Shetu, 22, daughter of Faizur Rahman, died after the motorbike she was on collided head-on with a truck on Dinajpur-Parbatipur road.
