# Ctg auto driver loses 15-day battle for life

Mohammad Abdul Aziz was supposed to return home in Chittagong on the night of December 1 as usual. But he returned 15 days later as a corpse.

The 50-year-old driver of a CNG-run auto-rickshaw died at the burn unit of Dhaka Medical College Hospital around 4:30am yesterday.

He had suffered burns over 35 percent of his body when blockaders hurled a petrol bomb at his auto-rickshaw at Hatazari upazila in Chittagong on that day.

"He wanted to live -- he wanted to go back home," said his wife Munni Begum at the DMCH burn unit.

Aziz was initially admitted to Chittagong Medical College Hospital (CMCH), and was shifted to DMCH on December 3 for better treatment.

Doctors at DMCH said the fire had damaged his respiratory organs.

He was driving to his Langal Mora home in the upazila after the day's work when he came under attack in Battali area, Aziz had told The Daily Star at the CMCH.

The auto-rickshaw was the only source of income for his five-member family. Aziz had borrowed from a friend to

# JU VC forced to leave campus

*Agitating teachers misbehaved with me, says Prof Anwar*

Agitating teachers of Jahangirnagar University yesterday forced its vice-chancellor Prof Anwar Hossain to leave the campus as per their earlier decision of not letting him enter there.

Around 9:00am, the teachers thronged the on-campus residence of Prof VC (Admin) Prof Afsar Ahmed being informed that Prof Anwar was there.

"We asked him not to return to the campus as he [Prof Anwar] had not complied with the chancellor's instructions of holding the VC panel election," said Prof Kamrul Ahsan of philosophy department, also the member secretary of the protesters' platform.

# Air raids in Syria kill 76

*28 children among victims, alleges rights body*

The Syrian air force was accused yesterday of killing 76 people -- including 28 children -- by unleashing barrels packed with explosives on Aleppo, a focal point for fighting between regime and rebel forces.

The bombardment, which activists described as "unprecedented", came as the United Nations said the number of Syrian war refugees in the Middle East was likely to double to 4.1 million by the end of 2014.

The number of people slain in Sunday's bombing of Aleppo "with explosive-packed barrels... rose to 76,"

including "28 children and four women," said the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights, updating its previous toll of 36 dead.

Observatory director Ramy Abdel Rahman said it was "one of the heaviest tolls from air raids since the beginning of the war" that flared after a brutal regime crackdown on Arab Spring-inspired democracy protests that erupted in March 2011.

Explosive-laden barrels were dropped on six rebel-controlled districts in the east, including Sakhur, Ard al-Hamra and Haydariyah, Abdel Rahman said.

The Observatory and activists said

government forces frequently drop the barrels filled with TNT on rebel-held areas of the war-torn country from helicopters and warplanes.

"The barrels of explosives are not like bombs. Their impact is not accurate as they are dropped without any guidance system, and that is why they cause a large number of victims," said Abdel Rahman.

The devices are made up of metal barrels that have a layer of concrete inside them "so that they cause as much destruction and death as possible," according to Abdel Rahman.


