Many Christians would like to celebrate Christmas with their families living outside the capital, said Nirmal Rosario, secretary general of the association.

"But this will not be possible if blockades or hartals are enforced at that time," he said.


The youth of Bangladesh are at risk of practicing unsafe sex due to lack of adequate sex education in schools which can contribute to the spread of HIV/AIDS and unintended pregnancies, said health experts.

Religious and cultural norms are also impediment to get sufficient lessons on sexual health in schools, they observed.

They made the observation at a convention of health experts titled, "Bangladesh's Sexual-Reproductive Health Programme: Experiences and Responsibilities," organised by Population Services and Training Centre (PSTC), at BIAM auditorium in the capital yesterday.

Addressing the event, Prof Rashid E Mahbub, president of Bangladesh Health Rights Movement, said the government must take the issue of sexual health with utmost importance as lack of knowledge in this regard has severe
