Jubo League men held with arms

Members of Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) arrested two Jubo League men along with arms, bullets and yaba tablets in Hugolbaria area of the town on Tuesday night. The arrestees are Sahajan Kabir alias Kazi Selim, 38, finance secretary of Natore district unit Jubo League and its activist Rezaul Karim, 35, son of Suruj Mian of Sadar upazila. Major Abdur Rahim, company commander of Rab-5, said on secret information, a team raided the area and arrested the duo. They also recovered two foreign made pistols, 11 bullets, three magazines, 24 pieces of yaba tablets and 19 mobile SIM cards.

Indian held for intrusion

Members of Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) arrested an Indian national on intrusion charge at Challishpara frontier in Daulatpur upazila on Tuesday night. Meanwhile, Indian Border Security Force (BSF) picked up a Bangladeshi cattle trader from the border point yesterday. Habildar Abdul Ohwab, in-charge of Ramkrishnapur camp, said they caught Abdul Hannan Mandol, 32, son of Aziz Ali Mandol of Sarkerpara under Jalangi police station in Murshidabad district of Pashchimbanga, at 8:30pm while he was entering Bangladesh through the border illegally. On the other hand, a BSF team from Jalangi camp caught Hablu Hossain, 42, son of Reyat Ali of Challishpara, early yesterday when he crossed the border area to bring his cattle.

'Arrest Sujon's killers'

A human chain was formed in Kanaikhali area of the town yesterday, demanding immediate arrest of the killers of local JCD leader Saifuzzaman Sujon. Secretary General Ruhul Amin Hawlader or Raushan Ershad or GM Quader or Ziauddin Bablu? We don't know," a JP leader told The Daily Star yesterday.

Another JP leader, whishing anonymity, said apparently the government was controlling the JP through an intelligence agency which had "picked up Ershad" from his Baridhara residence and took him to the CMH "for treatment" on December 12.

Two JP presidium members close to Ershad told The Daily Star that though the government earlier wanted to send the JP chief abroad, it now has backed out of the plan thinking that Ershad might make anti-government statements from abroad.

Besides, the move to send the former president abroad forcefully would tarnish the image of the government.

So the government will keep Ershad under surveillance at the CMH, mentioned the JP leaders.

However, JP presidium member Kazi Firoz Rashid told newsmen that Ershad would not go abroad.

"The party chief will receive treatment at the CMH," he said after meeting Raushan Ershad at her Gulshan residence.

On December 13, Ershad, through his special adviser Bobby Hajaj, told media that he was well and the government had confined him to the CMH for arrest as he did not agree to participate in the January 5 general election.

Bobby, who allegedly was forced to leave the country on Monday, also said Ershad nominated him as the party's spokesperson. Ruhul Amin Hawlader and GM Quader would give instructions to the party leaders and activists in absence of the JP chief, he added.

"But the reality is we go to Hawlader's residence in the morning and then to Raushan Ershad's in the afternoon as we believe she and Ziauddin Bablu are playing key roles behind the scene to maintain liaison with the government," a mid-level JP leader told this newspaper.

On November 18, Ershad announced to quit the ruling alliance, but joined the "polls-time government" the same day. He also declared that his party would contest the polls independently.

But in a dramatic move on December 3, the former military autocrat changed his mind and declared to boycott the election, saying that a proper atmosphere for the election was missing.

Despite the government's repeated efforts, the JP chairman did not change his decision.

Meanwhile, Ershad held a meeting with party Secretary General Ruhul Amin Hawlader at the CMH at Dhaka Cantonment yesterday evening, said JP sources.

Tobacco cultivation in Lalmonirhat doubles

Alarming increase in a year

A staggering 50 thousand hectares of land in the district has been brought under tobacco cultivation against last year's 25 thousand hectares, said sources of agriculture department, tobacco companies and farmers.

Farming of the harmful item sees an alarming rise in a number of villages in five upazilas under Lalmonirhat district as tobacco companies conduct successful door to door campaign to motivate farmers for the purpose.

Azizar Rahman, 60, of Baninagar village of Kaliganj upazila for the first time cultivated tobacco on his three acres of land that was earlier used to produce paddy.

Like Azizar, around two thousand farmers in the district have got their names listed as new tobacco growers with hope to get high profit.

"Seeing my neighbour's good earning from tobacco farming last year, I have now prepared my three hectares of land for the same purpose as paddy farming earlier failed to bring me expected profit," said Anwar Hossain, a farmer at Karnapur village in Aditmari upazila.

"We the tobacco growers always get seed, fertiliser and other inputs and technical support from the tobacco companies. After yield, the companies purchase the item for good prices," said Ashraf Ali, who has continued tobacco cultivation for the last 20 years at Saptibari village in Aditmari upazila.

"We get support includ-

ing interest-free loan from the company in our crisis period," said tobacco grower Nazrul Islam at Sarupur village in Aditmari upazila.

The area of tobacco farming has almost doubled at Karnapur village this year and the farm labourers daily wage has risen to Tk 250 from last year's Tk 200, said farm labourers Meher Ali, Shamsher Miah, Narayan Das, Manik Chandra, Taslim Uddin, Liakot Hossain and others.

Most of the farmers do not know the harmful effect

of tobacco cultivation on the soil but agriculture officials hardly come to make farmers aware about it, said farmer Haider Ali at Kakina village of Kaliganj upazila.

Tobacco growers cultivate the item from late November to middle December and harvest it in the last week of February to first week of March. They get 45 to 70 maunds of yield from each hectare of land and one maund (40 kg) tobacco is sold for Tk 3,000 to Tk 4,000.

Six tobacco companies

work in the field level in Lalmonirhat district round the year and they often make advance payment for the cultivation, farmers said.

Expressing deep concern over large-scale tobacco cultivation on paddy lands, Abdul Mazid, deputy director in Lalmonirhat DAE, said his department always conduct campaigns to build up awareness among the farmers but they forget the matter later due to temptation of high profit.

Panchagarh Sugar Mills also stops cane crushing

Opposition refuses to keep sugarcane vehicles out of purview of blockade

Mill's zone, said Shamsul Haque, GM (agriculture) of the mill.

President of Panchagarh Sugarcane Growers' Association Abdul Aziz told this correspondent that they told the BNP-Jamaat leaders to keep the sugarcane vehicles out of the purview of blockade but the parties are yet to take steps in this regard.

The cane crushing began around 15 to 20 days late this year.

If the mill fails to collect sugarcanes from the growers in time, the farmers will incur a huge loss as the weight of sugarcanes will reduce significantly due to dry season, he said.

General secretary of Thakurgaon district unit BNP Taimur Rahman said he discussed the matter with the district party leaders on Tuesday night where they refuted to keep the sugarcane crushing on Friday.

Till yesterday morning,

the mill produced 71 tonnes of sugar by crushing 2,600 tonnes of sugarcanes.

The production target was fixed at 5250 tonnes of sugar by crushing 75,000 tonnes of sugarcanes in the current season.

The mill was set to continue its operation for 75 days during the current season, he said.

Managing Director of Thakurgaon Sugar Mills Ltd. SM Abdul Aziz told this correspondent over cell phone that the mill's authorities and the growers were trying to convince the opposition as the mills and farmers would face losses due to interruption of production.

Missing youth found murdered

The body of a young man, who went missing from Sembagha area in Noakhali on December 12, was found floating in a pond at Nashratpur village in Laksham upazila of Comilla yesterday.

The deceased was identified as Mamun, 23, son of Amir Hossain of Khajuria village in Senbagh upazila.

Family members said Mamun remained missing since he went out of their house at around 12 noon on December 13.

Abul Khayer, officer-in-charge of Laksam Police Station, said local people spotted the floating body of Mamun at noon and informed the police.

Police went to the spot, recovered the body and sent it to hospital morgue for autopsy. Law enforcers are trying to unearth clue to the murder, the OC said.

KAWER CHAR HAS NO TUBE-WELL

3000 villagers use water from 200 deep holes

People of Kawer Char, a village adjacent to the Bay of Bengal, are facing acute crisis of safe drinking water in the winter as there is no tube-well in the area.

Minara Begum, another housewife, said they are suffering from various water-borne diseases like dysentery and diarrhoea as they have no other alternative but to drink impure and salty water.

At least 40 children suffered from diarrhoea and dysentery in the last one month for drinking salty and impure water from holes, villager Alauddin said, adding that the families could not provide medicines for their affected children as they live hand-to-mouth.

"We face acute crisis of safe drinking water in the winter season for want of tube-wells. Water that we collect from holes is unfit to drink, he said.

Khalifa, chairman of Dhulashar Union Parishad (UP), said people of Kawer Char under the union are facing acute crisis of safe drinking water in the current winter season as there is no tube well in the area.

"We requested the upazila administration several times to ensure safe drinking water for the villagers by sinking tube-wells, but to no effect," the chairman told the correspondent.

The water in the holes contains bacteria and arsenic and is unfit for human consumption.
