#### Muhith vows to protect economy against political violence

...... The government will take stern actions against any form of political demonstrations following the parliamentary election to prevent the economy bleeding further, Finance Minister AMA Muhith said yesterday.

"The blockade has to be stopped as quickly as possible. Our target is to take action in this regard after January 5," Muhith told reporters after a meeting with Heather Cruden, the Canadian high commissioner, at his secretariat.

Cruden dropped by his office to discuss some trade issues and tangentially expressed her concerns about the continued political unrest.

"The political violence has been going on for almost two months now. She asked how long a country can continue to be resilient."


# Exports surge 25pc in Nov

#### Overall shipments exceed target

..... Exports rose more than 25 percent yearon-year in November despite the nation's image crisis over the Rana Plaza collapse and political violence.

**EXPORT PERFORMANCE** 



The country earned \$2.21 billion last month, which was 6.05 percent more than the target, according to the data released yesterday by the Export Promotion Bureau.

As usual, the garment sector, which accounts for the bulk of the country's

total exports, led the way, raking in \$1.77 billion alone. Knitwear products brought home \$877.61 million in November, up 34.2 percent from the previous year, while woven garments fetched \$889.35 million, an improvement of 25.3 percent over 2012's November receipts.

The latest data from the EPB might go some way towards easing the exporters' helplessness in the face of tough business conditions at home for almost a year now due to political turbulence.

Shubhashish Bose, vice-chairman of EPB, gave full credit to the exporters for the continued rise in exports earning. "It proves that the entrepreneurship of our exporters has developed to great lengths -- they defied all odds to carry on their production."

"It also manifested that the sourcing countries still see Bangladesh as a major supplier. Very few nations will be able to supply basic garments to the European Union than Bangladesh does," he told The Daily Star.

Bose also said the country's pharmaceuticals sector is increasingly getting special attention from overseas buyers. "They have started to call Bangladesh a haven when it comes to sourcing medicines."

### Edotco to buy Robi towers for \$145m

Edotco Bangladesh Co Ltd (e.co), a new tower operating company, is buying the passive networking infrastructure of Robi at a price tag of \$145 million, said Andy Rolt, managing director of e.co.

The company will invest an additional \$50 million in the next one year to upgrade and expand its network to operate these assets. It will provide tower services to all telecom, Wi-Fi, WiMax and other similar organisations with communication needs.


The company is part of the e.co Group, which is a newly formed operation within the Malaysia based Axiata Group, owner of the Robi help Robi, but as a new revenue network.

Michael Kuehner, the outgoing chief executive of Robi, said engaging the new tower company is an Axiata

group decision to manage towers and batteries as these are not the main elements of the telecom business.

"Our revenues are from customer calls and internet, but their (e.co) focus is purely on towers."

The company was not formed to



stream for the group, Kuehner said.

Currently, e.co will focus on renting out space on its BTS (base transceiver) sites for customer

antennae and radio equipment, along with power to operate the equipment. "Our BTS sites include ground-

based sites, rooftop locations and specialised in-building solutions. We support power and cooling systems too," Rolt said.

The company began as a subsidiary of Robi but now it is independent and will do business separately, he said.

On business prospects in Bangladesh, he said, "There are 27,000 towers and we hope that a maximum number of sites will be shared in a commercial manner."

Currently, the company has more than 6,000 towers in operation, according to the company's website.

The telecom regulator had enacted an infrastructure sharing guideline to let telecom operators share their towers, but the initiative was not successful.

## Cross-border seed trade hits limelight

Bilateral cooperation on cross-boarder exchange of rice seeds will benefit both Bangladesh and India significantly because of their similarities in agroclimate conditions, said a study.

"Increased cooperation will help millions of farmers to have more access to better quality seeds at a cheaper price," said Mahfuz Kabir, coauthor of the study -- Bangladesh-India rice seeds trade: trends, issues and policy perspective.

There is a persistent demand and supply gap in rice seeds in Bangladesh hovering around 180,890 tonnes to 189,415 tonnes in last several years, he In India, the situation is reverse. In 2013,

there is a surplus of 42,572 tonnes of rice seeds in four eastern Indian states -- Bihar, Jharkhand, Odisha and West Bengal.

"This gap can potentially be filled by export of Indian rice seeds of both hybrid and high yielding varieties," said Kabir, also senior research fellow of Bangladesh Institute of International and Strategic

Studies.

He spoke at an international conference on "addressing barriers to rice seeds trade between India and Bangladesh" co-organised by CUTS International and Unnayan Shamannay at BRAC Centre Inn in the city yesterday.

CUTS International and Unnayan Shamannay, two development organisations of India and Bangladesh, conducted the study with support from Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. The findings of the study were shared at the conference.


