Focus shifts to Sunday

18-party, govt face off over march to Dhaka

The government and the opposition are on the verge of a face-off, as the BNP-led alliance is determined to make Sunday's march to Dhaka a success to compel the government to postpone the January 5 election.

On the other hand, the government has taken a tough line and will do whatever is necessary to frustrate the 18-party combine's plan. It might deny the opposition permission to hold the programme, according to government sources.

Meanwhile, BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia has said the government will face dire consequences if it tries to obstruct the opposition's march.

She made the comment while speaking to a delegation of the Christian community at her Gulshan office on the occasion of Christmas.

The main opposition party yesterday sought permission from the Dhaka Metropolitan Police to use loudspeakers around its Nayapaltan central

She looks at her burnt husband, wipes her tears off

Shirin Aktar could hardly look at her husband who was groaning in pain at the burn unit of Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

Her husband Faizul Islam, a traffic constable, received burns in Tuesday night's arson attack on a police bus near Bangla Motor. The attack was carried out at 11:20pm, hours after the opposition's 83-hour blockade had ended.

The injuries were so severe that skin of his face was peeling off.

Shirin Aktar heard about the attack around 1:30am yesterday but she could not immediately come to Dhaka from Gazipur as both her young children were sick.

"My children and I will become destitute if something happens to him," she said

AL aloof, alone

Never before in Bangladesh's political history, has any major political party faced such present and future isolation at home and abroad as is being suffered by the Awami League.

And the way the ruling party has been reckoning the situation is bizarre, dangerous and yet inexplicable. It looks like no book on politics has written any chapter on the AL's present course.

The AL is today isolated domestically on its plan to hold a one-sided election that many have already termed farcical.

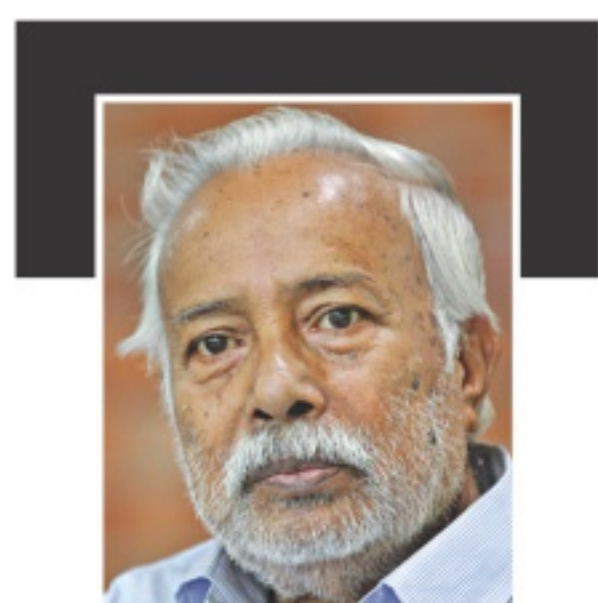
It has successfully left the BNP, the other major party, out of the election. But it has also failed to rope in the 'third'-in-line Jatiya Party (JP) which it thought would be its partner in political gambit. Even today, nobody is sure about the JP's position on the January 5 election.

JP chief HM Ershad is interned in the name of treatment (and was about to be sent abroad), something that reminds us of the bygone years of dictatorial rule by Pinochet and Saddam Hossain.

Using brute force, the ruling party is still getting some half-hearted support from Ershad's wife Rawshan.

The AL's other ragtag election contestants are name-only parties. Nobody believes they could ever win a single seat in

Icy diplomacy

A serious diplomatic standstill has been created over the last few months as most countries have suspended bilateral and multilateral engagements with Bangladesh due to the deadly violence centring on the election.

Diplomatic sources say there has been no official visit for negotiations for aid, loan, project approval or development initiative for long, except for those from countries like the US, the UK, China and India that are closely associated politically with Bangladesh.

They add countries like Japan, Korea and Australia and most European and western countries have almost suspended all of their activities here.

Bangladesh officials said it would be very difficult to make up for the pending engagements with the foreign countries if the current standstill was not removed immediately.

From European Union, the last visit was paid by a five-member Election Exploratory Mission from September 7 to 23.

There has been no high-level visit from Korea, an important development partner

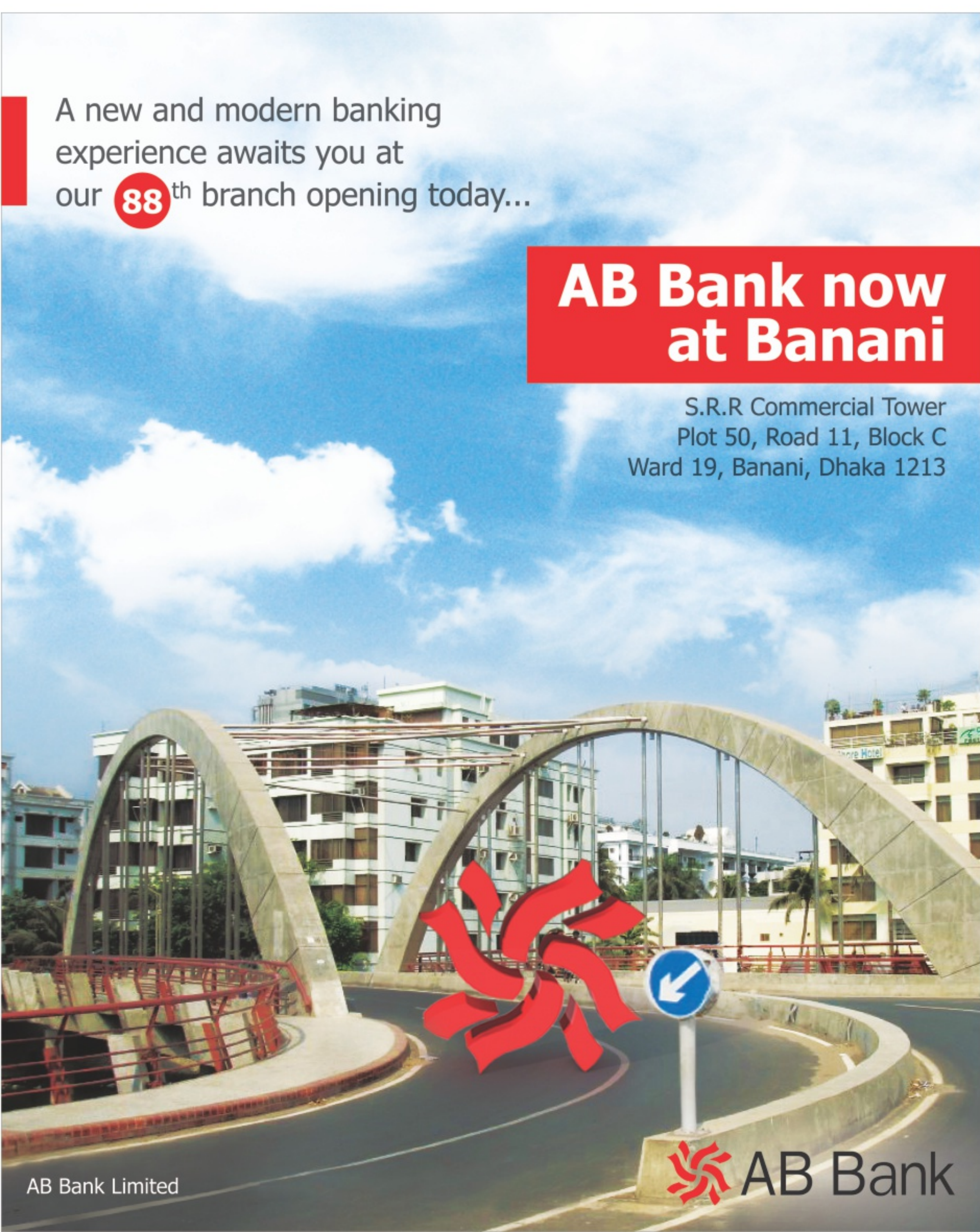
