ADP implementation rate likely to go down this fiscal

Fears leading economist

Although the implementation rate of the Annual Development Programme (ADP) hit 96 percent in the last fiscal year 2012-13, its progress in this fiscal is likely to suffer a major setback due to the ongoing political unrest and violence, said a leading economist.

Dr Mustafa K Mujeri noted that there was marked improvement in the last fiscal year in the ADP implementation progress compared to the previous few fiscals. "But, under the present political circumstances, implementation is being hampered in various sectors, especially at the field level, for which the country is likely to witness lower implementation rate in the last five months of the ongoing fiscal."

According to sources at the Implementation Monitoring and Evaluation Division (IMED), the implementation progress is likely to witness lower rate during the July-November period of the current fiscal compared to the same period of the last fiscal although the official data is yet to be revealed.

The implementation progress except the self-financed projects in the first four months (July-October) of the current fiscal (2013-14) stood at 15 percent compared to 20 percent during the same period of the preceding fiscal.

Saying that a congenial atmosphere is not prevailing in the country to reach the desired level of expenditure in the infrastructural sector, Dr Mujeri, director general of the Bangladesh Institute of Development Studies (BIDS), observed that SEE PAGE 4 COL 2

Dhaka agrees to send more troops to S Sudan

Responding to UN Secretary General Ban Ki-moon's call, Dhaka has agreed to send one battalion of additional troops for peacekeeping in the UN Mission in South Sudan, which is rife with bloody ethnic strife.

"We have already taken an initiative to send a battalion of infantry of the Bangladesh Army, and hopefully we will be able to send the peacekeepers in the next eight to 10 weeks at the maximum," said Dr AK Abdul Momen, ambassador and permanent representative of Bangladesh to the United Nations in New York.

Talking to The Daily Star yesterday by phone, he said Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina gave the commitment to the UN chief when he (Ban) called her on Tuesday.

The number of personnel varies in battalions, but usually one infantry battalion comprises 750 plus troops, according to Bangladesh Army sources.

This fresh one battalion is in addition to 1,450 troops, which are being sent to Mali for the UN peacekeeping, he added. "We are considering an inter-mission transfer...as there is

urgency and thus we can immediately transfer some equipment and Bangladeshi troops from the Congo mission,

4 hurt while making crude bombs in Gazipur

Four people sustained injuries when one of the crude bombs they were making exploded in Dattarapara Himardighi of Tongi in Gazipur yesterday.

One of them, Shahidul Islam, 35, is critically injured and has been taken to Dhaka Medical College Hospital from Tongi Government Hospital.

Ismail Hossain, officerin-charge of Tongi Police Station, said a bomb exploded when Shahidul and his three accomplices were making bombs at his rented house.

The other three were not hurt badly and managed to flee, the police officer added.

Police recovered four bombs and three bullets from the scene.

Police also detained Shahidul's wife Rina and daughter Laboni for questioning.






