







WAR CRIMES TRIAL OF SAYEDEE

Witnesses on their nerves

Prosecution witnesses in the war crimes case against Jamaat leader Delawar Hossain Sayedee are passing their days amid insecurity and have demanded that the government take long-term measures to ensure their safety.

Most of the 28 witnesses who testified against the Nayebe-Ameer of Jamaat-e-Islami are from Zianagar upazila of Pirojpur.

On February 28, International Crimes Tribunal-1 sentenced Sayedee to death and the Supreme Court is currently hearing on his appeal petition filed on March 28.

Fear of attacks has gripped the witnesses following the killing of one witness and an attack on another in the upazila. "We don't feel ourselves safe. We are afraid of attacks on

our lives," said Manik Pasari, a key witness from Parerhat of Zianagar, who first filed a case against Sayedee accusing him of committing crimes against humanity during the Liberation War. "Though police are guarding us now, short-term security

measures won't work. Sayedee's supporters won't spare us so easily," said a visibly worried Manik. Modhusudan Gharami, another witness from Parerhat,

said, "I have been given police protection for now but they cannot protect me for the rest of my life." Earlier on December 8, prosecution witness Mostafa

Hawlader was hacked in Zianagar and succumbed to his injuries at the Dhaka Medical College Hospital two days On October 28, alleged Jamaat-Shibir men attacked the

house of another prosecution witness, Mahabubul Alam Howlader, in the same upazila. He, however, managed to escape unhurt as he had hidden himself in the attic.

29 Public Universities

Admission in a shambles

Aspirations for higher education, it seems, are not going to be realised any time soon.

Thanks to the ongoing political unrest and back-to-back hartals and blockades, 15 of the 33 public universities could not hold admission tests for the 2013-14 academic session.

Twelve of them held the tests, but could not complete the post-test admission procedures.

Students aspiring for admission to Bangladesh Agriculture University, Mymensingh, have been the lucky ones since the admission process there has been completed. Their classes will SEE PAGE 10 COL 5 start on January 8.

The Chittagong University authorities have completed the tests for six out of eight units. The exams for the other two, after being rescheduled four times, are now scheduled for today, according to the university website. However, the subject nomination stage is yet to be completed for some of the units.

The other four universities, one of which has held the tests, are yet to finish the admission process.

Thousands of other aspirants who have taken the admission test at one or more universities, and the ones who have applied but are yet to take the tests, are suffering from a great deal of anxiety.

The public universities, which can

accommodate around 50,000 new faces, usually hold admission tests between November and December and start taking classes in January. But the current political situation has forced some universities to leave the tests for next January.

The authorities fear that if the situation does not change, it would plunge into a severe crisis many universities that are already troubled with varying levels of session jams.

Admission seekers say they are very uncertain about the tests and utterly frustrated. They would be in a serious problem if the admission tests are held in quick succession.
