




Suchitra Sen in ICU



Hospitalised after a respiratory tract infection, legendary actress Suchitra Sen was shifted to the ICU of a private hospital on Sunday night.

"She complained of breathlessness in the evening after which she was taken to the ICU," a source at the super-specialty Belle Vue Clinic told PTI News Agency.

The 82-year-old actress, who lives a secluded life, was admitted to the hospital on December 23 after she had respiratory troubles. Her granddaughter, actress Raima Sen, however, said she was doing better.

Sources said Sen also has diabetes which complicated the matter further. She was being administered antibiotics and oxygen, they said, until this report was written at 7pm.

Sajal left behind many others to take home the trophy of Power Voice, a musical programme on Channel 9.


Kona was seen active in hosting a TV programme, besides singing.

Later, the guests distributed prizes among the winners.


Blockbuster Cinemas premiere "Gravity" 3D

Tommy Emmanuel received his first guitar in 1959 at age four, being taught by his mother to accompany her playing lap steel guitar. At the age of seven, he heard Chet Atkins on the radio. He vividly remembers this moment and says it greatly inspired him. By the age of six, he was a working professional musician. Recognising the musical talents of Tommy and his brother Phil, their father created a family band, sold the family home and took his family on the road. With the family living in two station wagons, much of Emmanuel's childhood was spent touring Australia with his family playing rhythm guitar, and rarely going to school. He is, of course, regarded today as one of the greatest acoustic guitarists of all time.
