

Steyn sets up easy win

South Africa keep No.1 position

 Dale Steyn took two early wickets to set up an emphatic 10-wicket win for South Africa on the fifth day of the second and final Test against India at Kingsmead on Monday.

The win clinched the two-match series for South Africa after the first Test in Johannesburg was drawn. It also confirmed South Africa's ranking as the world's number one Test team ahead of second-ranked India.

Fast bowler Steyn set the tone for South Africa by taking two key wickets in his first two overs of the day. He followed up with a third wicket - his 350th in Tests - with the second new ball and finished with three for 47 as India were dismissed for 223, leaving South Africa a target of 58.

Alviro Petersen and Graeme Smith need only 48 minutes and 11.4 overs to knock off the runs. It meant that Jacques Kallis, playing in his last Test, did not need to bat again after his first innings of 115 built the platform for South Africa to take a crucial 166-run first innings lead.

Steyn dismissed overnight batsmen Virat Kohli and Cheteshwar Pujara after India resumed on 68 for two. Vernon Philander dismissed Rohit Sharma and left-arm spinner Robin Peterson took two wickets in one over before lunch to leave India facing defeat with only the tail to come.

Ajinkya Rahane carried India's hopes and made a fighting 96, his second half-century of the match, before he was last man out.

Focussing on the off-field events of players' lives is not a strategy that The Daily Star takes up, however, the most recent exchange that the 26-year-old had with one of its reporters, who was singled out during a gathering of reporters at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium on Sunday, has compelled us to publish this report.

Here is a word-to-word transcript of the conversation:

Shakib: Are you not from The Daily Star? How could you publish that photo? Should I sue your paper?

Daily Star: Not quite sure which photo you're talking about.

Shakib: You work for The Daily Star and you don't know which photo I am talking about? What kind of a job do you do? (turning towards the

other reporters) They (The Daily Star) published a cover photo of me in some 'Showbiz' magazine. What's your owner's name again? Some Mahbub ...?

By which time the reporters started asking questions regarding the game that he had just played.

Showbiz, a supplement of The Daily Star, published a cover photo, which included Shakib and his wife Umme Ahmed Shishir and provided by the couple's official photographer, for a year-end issue including the most popular events of 2013.

The left-hander obviously had a problem with that and it is likely that he would have been a happier person had he been able to sell the photo to this newspaper. But in that case he should have instructed his photographer not to give his photograph to the press.

"If someone had had this type of accident without a helmet, they would definitely not be here," he said.

Aussies call up Doolan

Australia on Monday added batsman Alex Doolan to their squad ahead of the final Ashes Test against England as doubts remained over the fitness of some players.

Cricket Australia said the Tasmanian was the only addition to the squad which is leading the series 4-0 and firm favourite to win the fifth Test starting Friday at the Sydney Cricket Ground.

Doolan is expected to be available if all-rounder Shane Watson is ruled out after suffering a groin strain during the fourth Test win in Melbourne. Fast bowler Ryan Harris is also battling chronic knee soreness.

"With some players still being assessed by our medical team after four demanding Tests, we have decided to add Alex to ensure we have sufficient cover in our batting line-up should it be required," national selector John Inverarity said.

"Alex is a talented player who came under strong consideration for selection ahead of the Ashes series after a string of solid performances in four-day cricket for Tasmania at the start of this season, but also after an excellent finish to last season."

Despite the call-up, bowling coach Craig McDermott predicted no changes to the attack for the fifth Test.

"I fully expect we'll have the same team, or the same bowling group in Sydney," he said.

Pakistan rely on bowling First Test against SL from today

Pakistan will rely on their strong bowling line-up led by off-spinner Saeed Ajmal to tame Sri Lanka in the three-match Test series starting in the United Arab Emirates (UAE) Tuesday.

Pakistan won the preceding one-day series 3-2 on the back of penetrative bowling and strong batting, but captain Misbahul Haq warned that they need to be at their best to beat Sri Lanka in the Tests.

"Ajmal has been performing a key role for us and we hope for the best in this Test," said Misbah, who led Pakistan to a 1-1 series draw against world number one South Africa in their last Test series, in the UAE in October.

"We know each other well so it will be a good contest," said Misbah. "We know that the Sri Lankans are good in these conditions, and with players like [Kumar

Sangakkara and [Mahela] Jayawardene, they are a dangerous side."

"So we need to play good cricket to win."

Pakistan beat Sri Lanka 1-0 in the UAE in 2011, with Ajmal taking 18 wickets in three Tests while Umar Gul (14 wickets) and Junaid Khan (12) shouldered the burden of the pace attack.

Despite the loss, Sangakkara scored 516 runs including a double century in Abu Dhabi. He and Jayawardene are the stalwarts of the team's batting.

Sangakkara, a stylish left-hander, was also the star when Sri Lanka beat Pakistan 1-0 at home last year, scoring 490 in three Tests.

By contrast, Pakistan's batting has been vulnerable and they were dismissed for 49 and 99 this year.

But Mohammad Hafeez's return to form, with three centuries in the one-dayers against Sri Lanka, and the experience of Younis Khan and Misbah will boost them.
