JSD vows to work from both within, outside govt

Announces 31-point manifesto

If the Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal (JSD) candidates win in the next parliamentary elections, they will work for the country from both within and outside the government and parliament, party chief Hasanul Haq Inu said yesterday.

The president of the JSD made the statement during announcement of party's manifesto at the party office on the capital's Bangabandhu Avenue.

Sharif Nurul Ambia, general secretary of the JSD, a component of the 14-party alliance government, read out their manifesto of the election set for Sunday.

As in the last national election, four leaders of JSD got nominations as 14-party alliance candidate who are contesting with the "boat" symbol, while 19 others are contesting with JSD symbol "torch". As a party, it is also supporting

PROCESSION ON SC PREMISES

Pro-BNP-Jamaat lawyers defy ban

Also deny Tuesday's consensus with pro-AL lawyers about not staging protest there

A group of pro-BNP and Jamaat-e-Islami lawyers brought out a procession on the Supreme Court premises yesterday, ignoring the previous day's decision of not holding such programmes there and defying a 2005 High Court prohibition.

Around 1:00pm, they paraded around the SC building and ended up on the Supreme Court Bar Association (SCBA) premises, voicing their support for BNP's indefinite blockade to resist the "one-sided" January 5 election.

Chief Justice Md Muzammel

Hossain termed the demonstration there "unfortunate", SC Registrar AKM Shamsul Islam told The Daily Star.

In May 2005, the High Court banned all kinds of agitation on the SC or any court premises and boycott of court, he said, adding that such demonstrations were also prohibited by the Supreme Court rules.

"I think that the lawyers, who are holding rallies and bringing out processions on the Supreme Court premises, are aware of the 2005 High Court order and the Supreme Court

Two killed in Satkhira road crash

Two people were killed and another injured in a road accident within a short span of time on Satkhira-Jessore highway in Kolaroa upazila yesterday.

A Satkhira-bound bus hit a human hauler near Jugibari-Chhohoria crossing leaving its driver Eshak Ali Sardar, 52, of Sadar upazila, dead on the spot, said witnesses.

A short distance away, Mezbahar Dalal, 32, of Kolaroa upazila, was killed and his younger brother Amin, 17, injured when the same bus hit the engine-run van carrying them.

4 Gazipur brick kilns fined Tk 8 lakh

The Department of Environment (DoE) yesterday fined four brick kilns in Konabari of Gazipur Tk 8 lakh for violating environment laws.

They are Hazi Bricks and Co, Ismail Bricks and Co, Khan and Co, and Dhaka Bricks.

After a hearing at DoE Dhaka headquarters, Director M Alamgir fined them Tk 2 lakh each, said a press release signed by Assistant Director Md Hafizur Rahman.

The factories did not renew the environment certificates and were using 120 feet high chimneys which should be taller, said Hafizur.

VoIP equipment of Tk 50 lakh seized
Two arrested in capital

Rapid Action Battalion arrested two persons with a huge amount of voice over internet protocol (VoIP) equipment worth around Tk 50 lakh for operating the system illegally in the capital's Mohammadpur Tuesday night.

The equipment include 14 bank channels, 132 antennas, 2,772 SIM cards of different telecom operators, two computers, and nine mobile phones.

The arrested are Firoz Alom, 25, son of Moksed Hawlader, and Sohel Rana, 22, son of late Abdul Khalek.

However, Mithu Hawlader, 25, the mastermind behind the incident, managed to flee, Rab said.

The trio hailed from Kazlakati in Bakerganj upazila of Barisal.

Acting on a tip-off, Rab held them in a room on the sixth floor of a seven-storey building at Jatrabad, said Lt Col KM Azad, commanding officer of Rab-2.

Based on their information, the battalion raided a nearby house of one Mithu and recovered more VoIP equipments. None was arrested there.

BANGLADESH ISSUES CPB, BSD slam US, India's 'interference'

It is a "disgrace" that countries like the United States and India discuss Bangladesh's "internal matters", said leaders of Communist Party of Bangladesh (CPB) and Bangladesher Samajtantrik Dal (BSD) at a rally yesterday.

Letting "imperial powers" intervene in the nation's politics goes against the main values of the Liberation War, said Monjurul Ahsan Khan, former president of CPB.

The rally was held in front of Jatiya Press Club in the capital to observe what the left-leaning parties call "Anti-imperialism Solidarity Day."

"If we want to uphold the legacy of the Liberation War, we should be alert against imperialism," said Khalequzzaman, convener of BSD.

Different left-leaning political parties also paid respect to the memorial sculpture of Shaheed Matiul Islam and Mirza Kader at Jatiya Press Club yesterday.

The leaders of the parties said Shaheed Matiul Islam and Mirza Kader were killed on January 1 in 1973 when the police fired on a procession protesting the US invasion in Vietnam.

Police, Rab foil JP discussion
