## Police sue 30 BNP men for Enamul murder

Police filed a case against 30 BNP men with Shibganj police station in the district yesterday noon on charge of killing of pro-AL trader Enamul Haque on Monday.

Enamul was burned to death when opposition activist set fire to his shop, Sharmin Hardware, at Shibganj Bazar in Shibganj municipal area at night.

Enamul Haque, 60, son of late Reazuddin Mondal of Chaturpur Moholla in the municipal area, was a supporter of Awami League and also president of Shibganj upazila Shilpa O Banik Samity.

Sub Inspector Mohammad Ali filed the case with Shibganj PS at around 2:30pm accusing 30 Chhatra Dal, Jubo Dal and BNP men.

Of the accused, 15 were named while 15 others

remained unidentified, said Mizanur Rahman, officer in-charge (OC) of the PS.

Police arrested four people after filling of the case, said police.

On Monday, over 20 men attacked Enamul Haque's shop, torched his motorcycle, poured petrol inside and set the shop afire at around 6:00pm, said witnesses.

Police said, supporters of the main opposition party, infuriated by the arrest of activist Salauddin of Jatiyatabdhi Jubo Dal, the youth front of the BNP, set the shop of Enamul ablaze at Shibganj Bazar.

On information, fire fighters from Shibganj and Chapainawabganj rushed to the spot and extinguished the blaze around 11:00pm.

After the flames of the

two-storyed building were doused, fire fighters and law enforcers found the burnt body of Enamul Haque.

Earlier, at around 5:30pm on Monday, Rapid Action Battalion arrested Jubo Dal activist Salauddin for his alleged involvement in several criminal activities after February 28 last year.

"Salauddin is accused in six cases filed with Shibganj police station," the OC said.

But it was not clear from the statements of the family members or police whether Enamul had any hand in the arrest of Salauddin.

Contacted, Mohammad Zakaria, son-in-law of Enamul Haque, said "We did not file any case, for we knew that it would be of no use."

"Everybody in area knows who killed Enamul,"

## Joint forces round up Jamaat-Shibir men in districts

Joint forces have arrested 10 activists of Jamaat-Shibir from different areas of Satkhira district on charge of their involvement in vandalism and subversive activities, reports our correspondent.

A team, comprising members of police, Rapid Action Battalion and Border Guard Bangladesh, raided areas of Sadar, Kolaroa, Kaliganj, Debhata and Shyamnagar upazilas from Wednesday evening to early yesterday.

Ten people were arrested for carrying out vandalism and arson attacks during the BNP-led 18-party-enforced nationwide hartals and blockades, said Satkhira DB police inspector Azam Khan.

The arrestees are Abdus Salam, 28, son of Mafiz Uddin of Agordari village of Sadar upazila; Samiul Islam, 18, son of Aktarul Islam of Waria village, and Zahid Hasan, 16, son of Shahidul Islam of Patharghata village of Kolaroa upazila; Mosaif Gazi, 25, son of late Hanif Gazi of Chalatabaria village and Akbar Malik, 55, son of late Sayed Malik of Moutola village of Kaliganj upazila; Matiur Rahman, 25, son of Abu Hossain of Sushilgati village, Abul Hossain, 25, son of Monajat Gazi of Sreepur

village, Abdullah Al Mamun, 20, son of Shawkat Gazi of Bhatshala village, and Shahabul Islam, 20, son of Akbar Ali of Datpur village of Debhata upazila, and Hamid Molla, 48, son of late Nowsher Ali of Badhghata village of Shyamnagar upazila.

Among them, four are Jamaat activists and six Shibir activists.

In Joypurhat, joint force arrested seven activists of BNP and its political allies Jamaat-Shibir from three upazilas of the district yesterday. District police control room sources said, a team of the joint force raided Kalai, Khetlal and Sadar upazilas of the district from Wednesday midnight to early yesterday and arrested the seven.

Among the arrestees were five Jamaat men and two BNP and Islami Chhatra Shibir activists.

They were held on charges of involvement in vandalism and subversive activities during the recent hartal and blockade programmes, police said.

Joint forces in Jhenaidah have arrested two Jamaat activists and a BNP man in sadar upazila yesterday morning for their alleged involvement setting fire to vehicles and blocking roads in the name of blockade.

## Temple torched in Lalmonirhat

Criminals torched Shalmara Sarbojanin Puja Mandir, a Hindu temple at Shalmara village of Bhelabari union in Aditmari upazila under the district, yesterday dawn.

Unknown miscreants sprayed petrol around the tin-shed temple and set fire to it, causing damage worth about Tk two lakh, locals said.


"The local Hindus have been doing puja at Shalmara temple for the last 20 years. We always get cooperation from the Muslims in the village for the purpose. Never before the local Hindus faced such problem," said Profulla Chandra Roy, president of the temple management

Aditmari upazila chairman Sirajul Haque, also senior vice president of district unit of Awami League, said the criminals did the heinous act possibly to prevent Hindus from voting on January 5 parliamentary election.

Police is trying hard to identify the criminals involved in torching Shalmara temple, said Aslam Iqbal, officer in charge of Aditmari police station.

## Veg growers take brunt of hartals, blockades

Sadar upazila, Chaugacha Bazar, Rajganj Bazar in Monirampur upazila of Jessor and Barobazar in Jhenidah--meet a great demand for vegetables across the country.

Buyers from different areas come to these markets, collect vegetables and supply them to different places, including Dhaka.

Four wholesale markets--Barinagar-Satmail under

But poor presence of buyers due to political unrest forced the growers to sell vegetables at throwaway prices.

During a recent visit to Barinagar-Satmail wholesale market, this correspondent saw eggplant was being sold at Tk 3 to 5 per kg, while one cabbage, weighing about 1.5 kilogram at Tk 6, beans at Tk 2 to 3 per kg and radish at Tk 1 to 2 a kg.

Mikail Hossain of Shalikona village under Sharsha upazila said they had to count huge losses in the last few weeks as vegetable prices came down drastically. "We sold cauliflower at Tk 11 per kg, green chili at Tk 25 per kg, tomato at Tk 30 per kg, and papaya at Tk 5 per kg," he said, adding that they could not even recover the price of insecticides used in their fields by selling vegetables.

Sirajul Islam, lessee of Barinagar vegetable market, said 35/40 truckloads of vegetables are being sent to the capital and other districts across the country from the wholesale market on Sundays and Thursdays. During blockades, the number of trucks on the days was reduced to 15, he added.

Before blockades, around 20/25 vegetable-laden trucks were sent to different markets across the country on the other days of a week, but the number was reduced to 10 during blockades, he further said.

Jessor district office of the Department of Agriculture Extension (DAE) has fixed the vegetable production target at 3 lakh tonnes from 15,000 hectares of land in the
