

Hindus send females away

Males stay back at houses damaged by BNP-Jamaat in 4 districts

STAR REPORT

Most of the Hindu families who had been attacked since election day, have sent their young female members to relatives' homes elsewhere fearing more Jamaat-BNP attacks on them.

Meanwhile, reportedly Jamaat-BNP men carried out fresh attacks on the minorities on Tuesday and yesterday, injuring five, burning seven homes and two temples, and vandalising idols in five districts.

Panicked Suzen Chandra Das, 60, died supposedly of a heart attack in Joypurhat when the criminals set his home on fire on Tuesday night.

Jiten Chandra Das, younger brother of the deceased, said his brother suffered a cardiac arrest seeing the house on fire, our correspondent reported.

Alleged Jamaat-Shibir men had attacked and set fire to three Hindu homes, including Suzen's, at Sonakul of Panchbibi in Joypurhat around 10:30pm on Tuesday. Locals said family members noticed their heaps of hay on fire as well but could not identify who had set the fires.

In another incident, unidentified criminals set fire to the paddy reserves of Kiran Chandra Roy and Sukumar Kumar in Shyampur village of Panchbibi in Joypurhat.

BNP blames AL men for attacks

BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia last night claimed that the BNP-Jamaat had no relation with the post polls attacks on the religious minorities.

She also rejected outright the prime minister's claim that the opposition men were responsible for the attacks.

The BNP chief was exchanging views with a delegation of pro-BNP journalists, teachers and lawyers at her Gulshan residence around 9:30pm.

Ruhul Amin Gazi, convenor of the Peshajibi Shamannay Parishad, led the 12-member team.

The opposition didn't contest the January 5 elections. Therefore, it is out of question that opposition activists attacked the minorities for going to polling centres. We've no

Hartal goes, blockade on

No respite from violence, public suffering

Although the opposition enforced 60-hour countrywide hartal ended yesterday amid reports of violence across the country, its non-stop nationwide blockade of rail, roads and waterways will continue.

On December 30, the BNP called the indefinite blockade from New Year's Day to resist what it called the one-sided January-5 parliamentary election.

Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir, acting secretary general of BNP, in a statement yesterday urged party leaders and workers, its allies and the people of the country on behalf of Khaleda Zia to continue the blockade as part of its ongoing "mass movement".

O-, A-LEVEL EXAMINEES Police protection on call from guardians

Police will escort O- and A-level examinees to the exam centres if their parents contact the local police stations asking for it, DMP Commissioner Benazir Ahmed said yesterday.

"Police escort will be provided as per the parents' requests. They will have to contact the police stations prior to the exams," he told a press briefing at the Dhaka Metropolitan Police (DMP) Media Centre on Minto Road in the capital.

The DMP boss said the decision was taken after parents had repeatedly communicated to the police their concern for the

students' safety amid political violence.

The police stations under which the capital's eight exam centres are located have already been asked to take the necessary steps, a DMP official said.

"If an examinee comes to the police station and asks for help, police will escort him or her all the way to the centre," Masudur Rahman, deputy commissioner (media) of DMP, told The Daily Star.

He said the DMP has yet to work out a plan to pick up the students from a certain place at a certain time, adding that they would go for it if necessary.

BID TO CHANGE CONSTITUTION Thai anti-graft body to charge 300 lawmakers

Thailand's anti-corruption body said it will bring charges against more than 300 politicians, mostly from the governing party, for trying to change the constitution.

A court ruled in November that the government move to make the Senate fully elected was unconstitutional.

The graft body said PM Yingluck Shinawatra would not face charges.

The move came as Thailand heads for a general election on 2 February, amid opposition protests.

Yingluck called the polls last month in a bid to end demonstrations by opposition supporters in Bangkok.

The protesters want Yingluck's government replaced with an unelected "People's Council".

They said her government's populist policies - which they allege are controlled by her brother, ousted former PM Thaksin Shinawatra - have created a flawed democracy.

Yingluck's party has drawn considerable support from rural voters and would be likely to win the election - which the main opposition party is now boycotting.

The National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) ruling will lead to another investigation and could
