13 Jamaat-Shibir men held in Ctg

Police early yesterday arrested 13 Jamaat-Shibir men in Lohagara and Sitakunda of Chittagong in several cases filed over political violence.

Of them, Shah Alam, general secretary of Charamba union unit of Jamaat, and Jainal Abedin, a Jamaat member, were held in their residences, said Lohagara police Assistant Sub-inspector Md Alauddin.

In Sitakunda, police arrested three Jamaat-Shibir men over hacking a Bangladesh Chhatra League leader Saturday. The arrestees are Abdus Salam, 35, of Jamaat-e-Islami; and Md Muhit, 21, and Sirajul Islam, 18, of Islami Chhatra Shibir, said Sitakunda police Assistant Sub-inspector Sharif Mofizur Rahman.

Md Azam, 22, president of ward-4 of BCL Sonaichhari union unit, was hacked in his shop Saturday.

3 burnt at Ctg ship-breaking yard

Three workers sustained injuries when a fire broke out at Kabir Steel Ship-Breaking Yard in Sitakunda upazila of Chittagong yesterday.

Md Lahu, of Bogra district, is being treated at Chittagong Medical College Hospital for 38 percent burn injuries while Tapan Jaladas, of Sitakunda upazila, for 16 percent burns and Md Riyad, of Satkania upazila, only needed first-aid.

The fire originated around 9:30am from gas trapped inside an iron pipe that the workers were cutting at the yard in Baro Aulia area, said Md Imran Uddin, supervisor of the yard.

Man shot in Gazipur

First power transfer between democratically elected govts in country

Claims Hasina while meeting aspirants for reserved seats for women in parliament

Stating that her government overcame enormous odds to successfully hold the January 5 elections, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday claimed that it was a first for Bangladesh's history that a democratically elected government handed over power to another.

"We hope this system continues and that is our aim," she said. Hasina's claim contradicts the fact that the February 15, 1996 elections under the then BNP-led government had also seen the same phenomenon.

She also thanked women who had defied threats and intimidation to vote in the elections, which were boycotted by the BNP-led 18-party alliance and followed by country-wide violence by the opposition men.

She was addressing at her official residence, Gono Bhaban, a programme to

Thai PM greets Hasina

Thai Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra yesterday congratulated Sheikh Hasina on her becoming the prime minister of Bangladesh for a third time.

The premier of the Kingdom of Thailand urged that the continued leadership and relations between the two countries would be further broadened and strengthened in the future.

She also expressed her determination to work closely for the mutual benefits of the two nations.

Earlier, India, Russia, China, Myanmar and Cambodia, among others, had congratulated Hasina.

Keep foreign friends' request, ditch Jamaat

Hasan Mahmud urges BNP, reveals AL-led govt's aim to turn Bangladesh into a middle income country within the present five-year tenure

Awami League (AL) Publicity Affairs Secretary Hasan Mahmud yesterday said in line with the request of BNP's "foreign friends" and the AL's view, the leading component of the 18-party alliance should cut ties with Jamaat-e-Islami.

He also stressed that the present AL-led government, as per the constitution, will stay for five years and turn Bangladesh into a middle-income country within this tenure.

"You may not keep our request, but you can keep the request of your foreign friends," he said, adding that BNP had been seeking assistance from the friends for the last two and a half years.

Hasan was addressing a discussion, "Contemporary Politics", organised by Thikana Bangladesh, a social organisation, in the capital's Jatiya Press Club.

Referring to the birth anniversary of BNP founder Ziaur Rahman which was observed yesterday, he said BNP's vow for the day should have been to quit the "politics of anarchy".

By-election in Rangpur 6 Feb 20

SC allows repolling in two Kurigram 4 centres

The by-election to the Rangpur 6 parliamentary constituency will be held on February 20, decided the Election Commission at a meeting yesterday.

Meanwhile, a chamber judge of the Supreme Court's Appellate Division vacated a High Court order, clearing the way for repolling to two centres in the Kurigram 4 constituency.

The Rangpur 6 constituency fell vacant when Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, also elected from the Gopalganj 3 constituency, relinquished the seat on January 8, three days after the parliamentary election.

The last date for submission and withdrawal of nomination papers is January 27 and February 3 respectively while the papers will be scrutinised on January 28.

Repolling to the two centres in the Kurigram 4 constituency was scheduled

Mintoo gets bail, Khokon doesn't

A Dhaka court yesterday granted bail to BNP chairperson's adviser Abdul Awal Mintoo in a case filed over the May 5, 2013 Hefajat mayhem while another court rejected bail to BNP lawmaker Mahbub Uddin Khokon in the same case.

The court granted bail to Mintoo on grounds that he was abroad during the Hefajat mayhem and had been suffering from various ailments. But he could not get out of jail as the bail petitions of two other cases are now pending with the High Court.

Another court rejected the bail to Khokon, also secretary of Bangladesh Supreme Court Bar Association, on grounds that police made him accused in the case as they found his involvement in "instigating" the Hefajat men.

The case was filed with Motijheel Police Station for killing sub-inspector Md Shahjahan in a clash between police and Hefajat-e-Islam men in the capital's Motijheel.

The court also granted bail to Mintoo in another case filed with Motijheel Police Station for torching vehicles, assaulting police and preventing them from discharging their duties the same day. Earlier on January 16, Mintoo also got bail in another case filed over the same charge.

The judge also rejected bails of Khokon in the cases-- one filed with Ramna Police Station for the December 24 Bangla Motor arson attack that left police constable Ferdous Khalil dead and another with Motijheel Police Station for attempting to kill police personnel in front of Ideal School and College last November 5.

Mintoo was arrested on November 8 last year while Khokon on December 26.

Asked about the order, senior lawyer Shajahan Miah, told The Daily Star that any court has a discretionary power
