

RANA PLAZA COLLAPSE

Search for the remains

Families, rights activists appeal to locate about 200 still missing

The discovery of more than 300 bones and three skulls in the ruins of Rana Plaza over the last one month suggests that the actual death toll in the disaster might be higher than the official figure of 1,135.

There have been confusions over the death toll, as none could confirm how many people were inside the building when it collapsed on April 24 last year.

According to estimates by workers' rights groups, more than 200 families are yet to find the remains of their loved ones.

DNA samples were collected from 322 unrecognisable bodies, and 157 of them could be identified.

Rag pickers found the skeleton of garment worker Obaidul Huq with his identity card and mobile phone at the site on December 13 last year.

With the hope of finding more human remains, rights activists and workers conducted searches there and found more than 300 bones and three skulls till January 3.

Activists, workers and families of the missing victims feel that a fresh search operation will discover more human remains at the site.

Zaher Majhi, father of missing victim Rabeya Khatun, 18, went to Savar from Bhola about a month ago when he learnt about the discovery of human remains.

"I heard a skeleton of a worker has been found at Rana Plaza. So I am hopeful that my daughter's remains might also be discovered," said the 50-year-old man whose

Bangabandhu Airport project to be revived

The government will restart the process of constructing Bangabandhu International Airport that it initiated during its last term, but backtracked at the fag end of its tenure.

"We will start afresh the proposed Bangabandhu Airport. I've already held a meeting and had discussions about it," Civil Aviation and Tourism Minister Rashed Khan Menon said yesterday.

He said this after inaugurating the high-speed taxiway built under a project of the Danish International Development Assistance (Danida) at Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport.

The high-speed taxiway will enable

Razakars killed 65 on a single day

Bagerhat freedom fighter testifies against Jamaat leader Yusuf

A freedom fighter yesterday testified that Razakar force formed by Jamaat-e-Islami leader AKM Yusuf had killed 60-65 people, mostly Hindus, at Ranjipur village in Bagerhat upazila on May 13, 1971.

Dilip Das from Ranjipur told the International Crimes Tribunal-2 that the marauding armed men also torched their houses and chanted slogans "Pakistan Zindabad, Yusuf Bhai Zindabad" while leaving the village.

Two of his relatives were killed in the attack, Dilip, the 21st witness in the case against Yusuf, said.

The two-member tribunal led by Justice Md Mozibur Rahman Miah with Justice Md Shahinur Islam recorded Dilip's testimony before adjourning the case proceeding until today, when he will face cross-examination.

Tribunal Chairman Justice Obaidul Hassan was not present



at the court yesterday.

During his 25-minute testimony, the 65-year-old Dilip said after the historic 7th March Speech of Bangabandhu and proclamation of independence on March 26, they [villagers] had formed Sangram Committee to guard their village.

"One day, we heard that Razakar force under the leadership of Yusuf Shaheb from



Violence flares up in Thailand

Blasts, gunshots hurt 28 at Bangkok anti-govt rally

Two explosions have hit an anti-government demonstration site in Bangkok yesterday, wounding at least 28 people, as Thailand's increasingly volatile political crisis drags on.

Police said the blasts near Victory Monument, in the north of the capital, were caused by fragmentation grenades – the same kind that killed one man and wounded dozens in a similar explosion targeting protest marchers on Friday.

The demonstrators, who control several small patches of Bangkok, were vying to overthrow the prime minister, Yingluck Shinawatra, and her government and derail elections on 2 February, which she called in a bid to quell the crisis.

Witnesses said the explosions occurred about two minutes apart. The first blast went off less than 200 metres from
