

Police finally find little Ria's body in septic tank

Police on Sunday night, finally recovered the body of the 7-year-old school-girl, allegedly abducted 26 days ago, from a septic tank of her neighbour's house at Poran village in Pirgachha upazila of the district.

The hapless girl was identified as Ria Akhtar, daughter of Abdul Rahim of the village and a Class-I student at Poran Government Primary School. Police and the family of the deceased said, on December 24 afternoon, Abu Zafar Jewel, 38, son of late Abul Kashem of the same village and some of his fellows abducted Ria when she was playing near her house.

The abductors demanded Tk 4 lakh as ransom from Ria's father Abdul Rahim over mobilephone.

They also threatened to kill the girl if the family failed to give the money without delay.

Later, the girl's father filed an abduction case with Pirgachha police station on December 31, accusing six including Zafar.

Abdur Rahim also informed all about the incident to Rab-13 of Rangpur camp.

On January 1, the members of Rab-13 came to know that Zafar was staying at his house.

The same night a Rab-13 team from Rangpur camp raided the house, arrested Zafar and picked up one of his accomplices -- Rasel Miah of the same village -- and handed them over to Pirgachha police.

On Saturday, police arrested Rasel Miah and on Sunday afternoon they arrested Salauddin in connection with the case.

Mokbul Hossain, officer-in-charge of Pirgachha police station, said on interrogation, Salauddin confessed to his involvement with Ria murder.

Later, as per his confession, police recovered Ria's decomposed body from a septic tank of her neighbour Abdul Haque's house in Rangpur camp.

50 shops of 3 markets in Noakhali gutted

At least 50 shops were burnt to ashes in a deadly fire that engulfed three markets in the town early yesterday.

Quoting witnesses, Fire Service officials said, the fire broke out from an unknown source at around 4:00am at Majidee Hawkers Market and soon spread to the adjacent Chandni Super Market and Feroza Shopping Complex.

Four units of Fire Service from Majidee and Chowmuhoni brought the blaze under control after three hours of frantic efforts.

Assistant Director of Fire Service Md Manir Hossain however said the fire might have been originated from an electric short circuit.

The fire completely gutted more than 42 shops and partially damaged 30 others, said an affected shop owner.

Besides, several shops were looted during the fire, they said.

The gutted shops include that of clothes, cosmetics, medicine, computer, readymade garments and mobile phone, locals said.

The affected shop owners and traders claimed that they incurred a loss of around Tk. 50 crore in the incident.

Dyke develops cracks just after construction

The flood control embankment in Piprakhal area has developed several cracks and become vulnerable soon after its construction in Mirzaganj upazila of the district.

Water Development Board (WDB) took up a Tk 75 lakh project to construct the 5.41-km-long dyke from Mirzaganj to Rampur to save the agricultural land in the area from saline water and tidal surge.

According to WDB sources, a local firm started construction of the flood control dyke from Piprakhal point in the first week of this month. But cracks have developed in the embankment just after 10 to 12 days, the sources added.

Locals said they have already informed the contractor concerned and the WDB officials of the matter, but no step has been taken yet to protect the embankment.

"Though the authorities concerned have

started construction of an embankment in the area, responding to our long demand, it (embankment) has developed cracks at the beginning of its construction," they alleged.

Abdul Maleq, 45, of Piprakhal area said if the cracks are not repaired immediately, the dyke will not sustain.

Contacted, work supervisor Main Uddin said a ditch has been made at the side of the dyke as they had to collect earth from there. "We are filling up the ditch as per instruction of the WDB authorities, the supervisor said.

Md Motaleb, sub-divisional engineer for Patuakhali WDB, said, as per terms and conditions of the work order, minimum 15 feet blank space should be kept between the bottom of the embankment and the ditch. Cracks appeared in the dyke as the contractor concerned did not follow it, he added.

Md Delwar Hossain, executive engineering of Patuakhali WDB, they have already asked the contractor to fill up ditch as soon as possible.

27 BNP men sued for Natore UP chairman murder

At least 27 BNP leaders and activists and its front organisations were sued on Sunday night on charge of killing Awami League leader and Kalam union parishad (UP) chairman Fazle Rahman Fanu at Shaol of Singra upazila.

Mainul Haque Chunnun, brother of the murdered AL leader, filed a case with Singra police station on Sunday night, accusing 27 men and naming 12 of them.

Ibrahim Khalilullah Fatih, organising secretary of Singra upazila unit BNP and also the former chairman of Kalam UP has been made the prime accused in the case.

The other accused include Kalam union unit Swachhchasebak Dal president Abdul Karim, Golam Rabbani, 24, Abdul Momin, 32 and Hasan Ali, 26.

Earlier, on Saturday night, police arrested three BNP activists, including Rabbani, in connection with the murder from different areas of Singra upazila.

Fazle Rahman Fanu, 60, executive committee member of the upazila unit AL, was stabbed to death by a gang around 12:30pm on Saturday.

Awami League source claimed that a gang of criminals, numbering 10 to 12, and led by Kalam union Swachhchasebak Dal president Abdul Karim, intercepted Fanu and his nephew Jahidul while they were returning to the UP office on a motorbike from the upazila headquarters after attending a party programme at noon and attacked them.

Meanwhile, Bangladesh Union Parishad Forum, Natore district unit, will form a human chain this noon to protest the killing.

Newly wed man 'takes own life,' youth murdered before wedlock

A newly wed man allegedly took his life on Saturday, the day after his wedding in Baralekha upazila of Moulvibazar district.

Fazlur Haque, 35, only son of Muffasir Ali of Surikandi village married Fetama Begum, a divorcee with two children, on Friday night.

On Saturday night, Fazlur locked in an altercation with his elder sister over a family issue, sources said.

At one stage, he tried to take his life by slitting his own throat with the help of a sharp knife which left him critically injured.

He was rushed to Baralekha health complex where the doctor declared him dead.

However, the death raised questions among locals as to whether it was case of suicide or murder.

In Bogra, a youth has been 'mysteriously' hacked to death a week before his marriage at Daspara in Dhunat upazila.

His body was found near his residence in Kazipur upazila of Sirajganj district at around 8:00am on Sunday, reports our correspondent.

The deceased was identified as Asim Kumar Das, 25, son of trader Anil Chandra Das of Dashpara village in Dhunat municipality area in the district.

Dhunat police, quoting of family members of the deceased said that the youth's marriage was fixed with Polashi Rani, daughter of Narayan Chandra of Gopinashi village under Bhuapur upazila of Tangail district on Sunday next.

Asim went to bed on Saturday night after the dinner. In the morning, the family members did not found him in his bedroom. After a search, they found his body in a crop field around 50 yards away from his residence.

Family sources also said that Asim got some money as dowry from his would-be father-in-law and he himself collected some money to bear his marriage cost. The criminals might killed him for taking away the money from him, they said.

Contacted, officer-in-charge (OC) of Dhunat police station Mobarak Hossain said Asim was hacked by sharp weapons to death by the miscreants.

102 bombs found in graveyard

Members of the Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) recovered 102 crude bombs from a graveyard at Moharajpur of Sadar upazila on Sunday night.

On a secret information, a team of Rab-5 from Chapainawabganj camp went to Chowdhury Crossing at Moharajpur village and seized the bombs hidden in ten bags at around 11:30pm in an abandoned condition, said Major Saifuzzaman, commander of Rab-5, Chapainawabganj camp.

Rab suspected that criminals kept the hand made bombs either for selling those or for carrying out subversive activities.

Away in Meherpur district, Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) recovered 13 bombs from Kulabaria village in Sadar upazila on Sunday night, reports our Kushtia correspondent.

Captain Ashraf Uddin, commander of Rab-6, told this reporter that on a tip-off, they recovered the bombs, that include 11 petrol and 4 hand bombs, from roadside at the village at about 9.30pm.

BASHAR MURDER

22 AL men sent to jail

A court here yesterday sent 22 Awami League leaders and activists to jail after rejecting their bail prayer in Jubo Dal leader Abul Basharmurder case.

Chief Judicial Magistrate Liaquat Ali Mollah passed the order when the charge sheeted accused surrendered to the court in the morning.

On October 5 last year, Abul Bashar, 36, vice president of Baraigram upazila unit Jubo Dal, was killed and another activist of the party Babul Hossain injured in a gun attack by criminals.

Later, Bashar's elder brother Abdul Khalek filed a murder case accusing 30 AL leaders and activists.

Police said, a charge sheet was pressed against 22 people including Nagar union unit AL secretary Mohammad Bakul, and ward unit AL president Nur Mohammad and Nagar union chairman Samsuzzuha Saheb on January 10.

Jamaat, JCD, Jubo Dal leaders held

The secretary of Pabna district unit of Jamaat and the chief of JCD town unit were arrested in Pabna town yesterday noon on various charges including violence.

The arrestees, Abu Taleb Mondol and Ariful Islam, were later sent to jail. Officer-in-charge of Pabna Sadar police station Kazi Haniful Islam said, police arrested Jamaat leader Abu Taleb Mondol and JCD leader Ariful as they were accused in dozens of cases filed for vandalism, cutting trees, digging roads, bomb explosion during hartals and road blockades recently. Police picked them up in connection with specific cases of violence, he said.

Protesting the arrest of the top Jamaat leader, Pabna district unit of Jamaat called a day-long hartal today. "Our party secretary was held in false cases. So, we have decided to observe a day-long hartal on Tuesday to protest his arrest", said Nayebe-e-Ameer of district unit Jamaat Zohurul Islam yesterday. In Dinajpur, a Jubo Dal leader, also union parishad chairman of Hakimpur upazila was arrested in connection with a vehicle vandalism case yesterday.

Arrestee Shah Alam, 40, is general secretary of Hakimpur upazila Jubo Dal and chairman of Khatramadhabpara union in the upazila. Earlier, a Dinajpur court issued a warrant for his arrest on January 17, police said.

On December 7, pickets of Jamaat-Shibir and BNP damaged two trucks in front of Hili Port. Later, Harun Ur Rashid, the owner of the trucks, filed a case with Hakimpur PS, accusing Shah Alam.

In Joyprhat, police on Sunday arrested 14 people in connection with several criminal cases from different areas of five upazilas.

Superintendent of Police Hamdul Alam said several teams of police conducted separate drives in Sadar, Panchbibi, Khetlal, Kalai and Akkelpur upazilas from Sunday midnight to early yesterday and arrested the 14. The arrestees include five
