Some provisions threat to freedom of expresion

Says rights platform of 19 NGOs STAFF CORRESPONDENT

Human Rights Forum Bangladesh, a platform of 19 NGOs, yesterday reiterated that some provisions in ICT (amendment) act were a threat to the existing human rights related laws and policies, particularly to the freedom of the press and citizens' right to express opinion.

In a written statement signed by Sultana Kamal, the forum's convener and a rights activist, the forum urged the government to make necessary amendments to the act through comprehensive discussions.

Referring to sections 54, 55, 57 and 61 under the act, the forum observed that there was a strong possibility of the misuse of these provisions for political and other motives.

There is no specific direction of which actions will be brought into cognisance using section 57 which includes some actions namely false, obscene, derogatory, instigating, tarnishing the state's image or hurting religious sentiment.

The ambiguities of these words must sanction the misuse of this act, the forum fears. As these actions were made nonbail-able under the section 57, these will breach the citizen's rights seriously. At the moment, the trials in cases against Odhikar secre-

Govt to appoint administrators for troubled pvt universities

The government will appoint administrators in troubled private universities if the institutes cannot resolve disputes on contentious issues like ownership and moving to their own campuses.

The education ministry also threatened to stop academic activities of these universities if the problems were not resolved through arbitrations.

The decision was taken at a review meeting at the ministry with Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid in the chair.

The meeting also discussed different cases filed over the issues, said a press release.

According to the release, the troubled universities are: Darul Ihsan University, Prime University, Northern University, Southern University, Asian University of Bangladesh, BGC Trust University, Queens University, and

America Bangladesh University. Measures will be taken to resolve the cases of the universities over Board of Trustees or outer campuses quickly by bringing those [cases] in one court, the

Shibir men clash with BCL activists at Sust

Vandalise 12 vehicles, windowpanes of buildings over arson on motorcycle of university unit Shibir president; 10 injured

Some 10 activists of Shahjalal University of Science and Technology (Sust) unit BCL and Shibir sustained minor injuries during a clash yesterday following vandalism allegedly by the latter's men after their president's motorcycle was torched.

Police fired some 40 rubber bullets in the air to disperse the warring factions half-anhour later.

Witnesses, including a Sust administrative officer, bus staff and shopkeepers,

preferring anonymity, claimed that around 30-40 Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) activists carried out the arson before the East Building around 3:00pm. In no time, around 40 Islami Chhatra

375 MW ELECTRICITY Ecnec okays 2 power plants

The Executive Committee of the National Economic Council (Ecnec) yesterday approved two power plants to produce a total of 375 megawatt (MW) under two projects.

One of the projects includes a 275 MW power plant, worth Tk 2,688 crore, to be set up in Barapukuria Coal Fired Thermal Power Station by 2017. China Industrial and Commercial Bank will provide Tk 1,836 crore for the project as buyer's credit.

The power station already has two power plants each having production capacity of 125 MW.

With this a total of 13 projects worth Tk 9,110 crore were approved during the Ecnec meeting with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina in the chair at NEC conference room in the capital.

The other 100 MW diesel based power plant will be installed at Chapainawabganj at a cost of Tk 1,114 crore. The HSBC would provide a credit of Tk 893 crore.

FAMILY PLANNING OFFICIALS Govt to fill up vacant posts soon

The government will soon recruit people to fill up vacant posts of family planning officials, said Health and Family

Welfare Minister Mohammad Nasim yesterday. Addressing a views-exchange meeting with officials of the Directorate General of Family Planning (DGFP) at its auditorium in the capital, he said he would talk to the public administration in this regard.

The DGFP now has 6,958 vacant posts.

The minister expressed hopes that the recruitment would yield a major boost in the country's family planning programmes.

He also emphasised his commitment to fight absentee-

ism among physicians. "Punishment for irresponsible behaviour should be expulsion from service as suspension proves to be inade-

quate," Nasim said. Suspended officials tend to lobby hard to regain their jobs and often succeed in their endeavour, he added.

He expressed his wish to enact a law permitting physi-

cians to be sacked for absenteeism.

The health ministry on Thursday suspended two doctors and a medical assistant for absenteeism at Valuka upazila of Mymensingh.


