Usually, the academy announces the award on February 18. But this year names of the award winners have been announced before the start of the book fair.

HC upholds EC: regulations on political party registration

Rejecting a writ petition, the High Court yesterday upheld the Election Commission regulations about registration of political parties. The regulations say a party must have

a central office and unit offices in one third of the districts and in at least 100 upazilas and at least 200 voters in every upazila to qualify for registration. The HC bench of Justice Farah

Mahbub and Justice AKM Zahirul Hoque delivered the verdict, rejecting the petition filed by one Saif Uddin Ahmed last year, said the EC lawyer. The petitioner had said it was

unreasonable and very difficult for a new party to meet the conditions.
