



## AL, BNP fail to get rid of rebels

Last date of withdrawal over, yet rebel candidates stay in many upazilas

Despite hectic efforts, Awami League and BNP have failed to convince their dissidents to quit the February 19 upazila parishad elections and support the party-backed candidates.

Some of the rebel candidates of the parties, however, stepped aside after negotiations yesterday, the last day for nomination withdrawal, according to information from the returning officers' offices.

A total of 405 aspirants yesterday withdrew nominations at all the 98 upazilas, including the one that is going for polls on February 24. Of them, 234 were chairman, 126 vice-chairman and 45 women vice-chairmen aspirants.

After the withdrawal, 432 are contesting for the posts of chairman, 513 for vice chairman and 329 for women vice-chairman, said Election

## The ignored now ignoring AL, BNP grassroots defy party directives

Factionalism and fragile chain of command have become apparent in the Awami League and BNP centring the upazila polls. Both the parties had repeatedly directed their grassroots to pick one candidate per post in the upazila parishad polls to improve the chances of victory but in almost every upazila, party mates stand as rivals.

The parties' warnings of stern actions

## AL blames 'intruders', BCL expels 2 leaders

As Bangladesh Chhatra League seems back with campus violence within a month of the new government taking office, ministers and ruling Awami League leaders yesterday rehashed some old rhetoric.

A day after the activists of Rajshahi University BCL, the pro-AL student body, attacked general students with firearms on the campus, the AL high-ups blamed it all on the "intruders," warning of tough action against them.

Such reactions are identical to those by top AL leaders following recurring campus violence in the past five years.

Meanwhile, Chhatra League yesterday expelled

its RU unit Joint General Secretary Nasim Ahmed Setu and Organising Secretary Samsuzzman Emon over Sunday's violence. The duo was seen brandishing firearms during the violence that left at least 100 people, including eight journalists, injured.

Over the past five years, public universities, medical colleges, polytechnic institutes and government colleges saw many incidents of violence, as the BCL men got involved in factional clashes and also fought with activists of the opposition parties. In some cases, the authorities had to close the institutions.

But most of the BCL men involved in those incidents went unpunished, as senior AL leaders

## Victim punished, accused spared Lalmonirhat imam held

A teenage girl has been ostracized in Lalmonirhat through a fatwa for her pregnancy after she was lured into a physical relationship with an adult with the promise of marriage.

The father of the 13-year-old girl filed a case with Aditmari Police Station on January 12, accusing Rezaul Islam, of Vatapara village, of developing illicit relations with the girl through deception.

Five days after the filing of the case, the imam of Vatapara Jame Masjid, Fazlul Haque, imposed the fatwa on the nine-month-pregnant girl and her family, forbidding villagers to engage in any form of interaction with them.

But neither the villagers took any action against Rezaul, 19, nor did police arrest him.

"I loved Rezaul. He said he would marry me and I believed him," the girl, who had just completed the fifth grade, told The Daily Star.

Since the victim was below 18, police filed a rape case, said Sub-inspector Aminul Islam, investigation

## RU authorities' role questioned

Students' demonstration against "commercialisation" of Rajshahi University was hurting the interest of the university authorities which prompted them to unleash armed Chhatra League cadres and police on the students Sunday, said a number of teachers and students.

The university authorities and police, however, claimed that "criminals of Islami Chhatra Shibir" had intruded into the demonstration, which "forced" the administration to launch the drive.

The university allowed the police to open fire on students while armed activists of pro-ruling party Chhatra League sporadically attacked the agitating students.

At least 100 students and seven journalists were injured on Sunday.

Students of university dorms left yesterday morning amid tight security after Rajshahi University was closed for an indefinite period Sunday.


A total of six cases were filed with Motihar Police Station in connection with the Sunday's violence. University Additional Registrar Saad Ahmed filed two cases against 60

Finance Minister AMA Muhith yesterday expressed disappointment at the failure of last government's initiatives, including implementation of PPP projects, the four-lane Dhaka-Chittagong highway and slashing of bank interest rate.

"We've everything, the money and design, but the implementation work of the Dhaka-Chittagong and Dhaka-Mymensingh four-lane projects couldn't be completed yet," he told a delegation of Dhaka Chamber of Commerce and Industry (DCCI) at his secretariat office.

"I think the contractors don't work properly.... I don't have necessary control over them," meeting sources quoted the minister as saying.

The government, he said, will build a 37-kilometre expressway stretching from the capital's Zero Point to Mawa of Munshiganj. An agreement will be inked soon to implement the \$1.5-billion project. Of the amount, the government will provide \$1 billion.
