## Drug peddler jailed in Benapole

A mobile court yesterday sentenced a drug peddler to one year's imprisonment soon after detaining him with 1kg of marijuana in Sharsha upazila in Benapole.

Two die in capital alone as bus crashes into road divider

Ten people were killed and eight others injured in road accidents in the country yesterday and Thursday.

Our staff correspondent reports, two pedestrians were killed and another was injured when a reckless bus of Suprovat crashed into a road divider on which the three were standing in Merul Badda area of the capital yesterday.

One of the victims was identified as Saidur Rahman, 26, a private job holder in Narayanganj. Injured Habibur Rahman was rushed to Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

Police seized the bus.
