ATTACK ON HINDUS IN PABNA OVER FACEBOOK POST HC directs govt to compensate victims

The High Court yesterday directed the government to compensate Hindu families in Pabna which had came under attack over a Facebook post that allegedly demeaned Prophet Mohammad (pbuh) in November last year.

The government was asked to compensate a total of 33 families within three weeks in Santhia upazila of the district.

Miscreants vandalised 29 houses, 10 business establishments and seven temples at the Bonogram bazar in the upazila on November 2 last year on allegation that a Hindu boy from the locality maligned Prophet Mohammad (pbuh) on a Facebook page, according to a government probe report submitted to the HC last

The probe body has assessed that properties worth Tk 43.42 lakh were damaged.

The government will have to pay Tk 43.42 lakh as compensation following the HC order, Deputy Attorney General Bishwojit Roy told The Daily Star yesterday.

Hearing a suo moto rule, the HC bench of Justice Quazi Reza-Ul Hoque and Justice ABM Altaf Hossain also directed police to arrest those responsible for the attacks based on intelligence agency reports submitted to the HC.



So far, 31 people have been arrested in this connection.

Following an HC rule issued on November 3 last year, the government formed the probe body to assess the damage caused by the attacks.

The HC passed the order yesterday after examining the report.

Based on a report published on The Daily Star under the headline "Hindus attacked in Pabna" on November 3 last year, the same HC bench issued the suo moto rule upon the government to explain why it should not be directed to take appropriate legal actions against the people responsible for attacks on the minority community.
