JnU students want dorm back from Haji Selim

Students of Jagannath University demonstrated on the campus yesterday, demanding return of their dormitory that Awami League leader Haji Mohammad Selim has allegedly occupied. Tibet Hall is currently occupied by Haji Selim, also an

independent lawmaker, said Shariful Islam, president of JnU Bangladesh Chhatra League. They demonstrated for about an hour till 1:30pm yester-

day when the university was closed. Haji Selim, however, refuted the allegations. "Ask them to

show me papers proving that this is their hall," he charged. Vice Chancellor Dr Mizanur Rahman said they were trying to reclaim the ownership.

Today, the students will submit petitions to three ministries--home, land and education--as part of their campaign to recover their dormitory.

"We will continue our struggle until we get the hall back,"

VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN

2 lakh cases filed in 11yrs, few cleared

Say organisers of One Billion Rising; announce demonstration for tomorrow

Around 200,862 cases of violence against women were filed between 2002 and 2013 but few were adjudicated, organisers of the One Billion Rising movement said yesterday.

Under the banner of "Uddome Uttorone Shotokoti", the global women's rights campaign will hold a demonstration on Valentine's Day with the theme, "Demanding justice".

The protest will focus on the unsolved disappearance of Kalpana Chakma, the Kabir, country director of ActionAid recent rape of two housewives in Jessore,

and the attack on female journalist Nadia Sharmeen by Hefajat-e-Islam, the organisers told a news conference at the capital's Jatiya Press Club.

"Kalpana Chakma disappeared in 1996, but even the investigation report has not been submitted yet. Similarly, although the physical assault on Nadia Sharmeen is a punishable offence, no such steps are being taken. The rape of the two housewives showed how women are targeted because of issues they are unrelated to," said Farah SEE PAGE 4 COL 3

1,100kg of hilsa fry seized, seven traders fined in capital

Mukuli Begum, 22, went into the room after receiving a phone call and was found hanging by her scarf from a ceiling fan around 11:00am, said police quoting her co-worker Sarna Begum.

She separated from her husband two months ago. The body was sent to the Dhaka Medical College morgue for an autopsy.

In this connection, he referred to the detention of Abu Sayed, chairman of SEE PAGE 4 COL 4




