

INTELLECTUALLY CHALLENGED Who?

They were made to sit under the sun for two and a half long hours and listen to speeches they could barely understand.

As a minister and top government and NGO officials spoke about various successes of the government, some 400 intellectually challenged boys and girls sat on the ground, bewildered.

Aged between five and fifteen, the children were brought to the Government Physical Education College at Mohammadpur in the capital around 9:00am and made to sit till 11:30am.

Some were seen holding umbrellas to protect themselves from the heat. Several others were on wheelchairs.

State Minister for Social Welfare Promode Mankin addressed the programme. Other speakers included Director General of the department of social welfare and development Ayub Hossain, lawmaker Mir Shawkat Ali Badshah, Dhaka district social welfare department Director Harunur Rashid and National Life Insurance Company Ltd Managing Director Jamal MA Nasir.

Recruit 200 factory inspectors by March

Suggest 5 envoys to regain GSP from US, confidence of EU

Five foreign mission chiefs yesterday gave the government until the end of March to show some "visible progress" towards enhancement of labour rights and factory safety, including the recruitment of 200 factory inspectors.

The focus is on the end of March deadline as the international community would be calling in April

to observe the first anniversary of the Rana Plaza collapse, Dan Mozena, US ambassador to Bangladesh, said after the meeting with commerce, foreign affairs and labour secretaries.

The secretaries presented the progress made on the 16-point action plan from the Obama administration for regaining the Generalised System of Preferences status, suspended on June 27 last year

US, MODI Friends, again

The United States has ended a decade-long boycott of the Indian opposition leader Narendra Modi over deadly religious riots as a top diplomat held talks with the man tipped to be the country's next prime minister.

Nancy Powell, the US ambassador to India, shook hands with Modi, who presented her with a bouquet of flowers at his official residence in western Gujarat state where he is chief minister, before entering closed-door talks.

Photos showed a smiling Powell receiving the flowers and later a locally made painting, but she did not speak to reporters after the almost hour-long meeting in the state capital, Gandhinagar.

"This meeting was part of the US mission's outreach to senior leaders of India's major political parties in advance of the upcoming national elections," the US embassy said in a statement.

Modi, leader of the Hindu nationalist Bharatiya Janata party (BJP), is accused by rights groups of turning a blind


