

'AL activists' attack Jhenidah book fair

3 cultural workers injured, fair postponed

Jhenidah Deputy Commissioner postponed an eight-day Ekushey Boi Mela 10 hours after his inauguration following an attack on the fair allegedly by the ruling Awami League men that left three cultural activists injured.

"The fair was postponed for today (yesterday) following the attack. We will take a decision after a meeting tomorrow (today)," DC Shafikul Islam told The Daily Star over cellphone.

Witnesses said activists of ruling AL, Bangladesh Chhatra League and Jubo League attack a cultural event at the fair around 7:30pm and vandalised its chairs, table and dais.

They launched the attack blaming that the DC had helped the pro-BNP candidate in February 19 upazila polls, sources said. However, the DC denied the allegation.

In the election, AL-backed Sadar upazila chairman candidate Kanak Kanti Das was defeated by pro-BNP Abdul Alim.

After the defeat, AL men, at a press conference at Jhenidah Press Club, declared to boycott programmes attended by the DC and demanded his immediate removal and re-election in the upazila.

Contacted, Jhenidah district AL Secretary Azizur Rahman said no AL activist was involved in the attack.

SCBA election on March 12-13

The 14-member executive committee of Supreme Court Bar Association will be elected by 4,044 Supreme Court lawyers through an annual poll on March 12-13.

The nomination paper submission will continue till February 27 and the deadline for withdrawal is March 3, SCBA Superintendent Nimesh Chandra Das said yesterday.

Probable candidates from the ruling Awami League-backed Bangladesh Sammiliti Ainjibi Samannay Parishad to run for president are former law minister Abdul Matin Khasru, AL presidium member Yusuf Hossain Humayun, Munsurul Hoque Chowdhury and Rabia Bhuiyan.

Their rivals from pro-BNP Bangladesh Jatiyatabadi Ainjibi Forum are expected to be former SCBA presidents Khandker Mahbub Hossain and Zainul Abedin and former state minister for law Shahjahan Omar.

Alphabet fair for children held

Wife 'kills' man in capital

A woman allegedly suffocated her husband to death at their house in the capital's Sabujbagh yesterday.

The deceased Nuru Mia, 48, a staff of Rajmoni Cinema Hall, used to live with his second wife in Bashabo.

Kawser Ahmed, victim's son, said his stepmother Aleya, who is involved in drug peddling, along with her accomplices killed his father. The body was hanging from a ceiling fan with the legs touching the bed which indicates that he was first suffocated and then hanged, said Sabujbagh police. Police arrested Aleya and four others in this connection.



Hizb-ut Tawhid men clash with locals in Rangpur 15 injured; 23 held

Activists of banned militant outfit Hizb-ut Tawhid clashed with locals in Purbo Shalbon area of Rangpur city Thursday night, injuring at least 15 people from both of the sides.

Police fired three rounds of gunshots, ten rounds of rubber bullets and charged baton on them.

Around 23 persons were held on the spot.

Md Abdul Qader Jilani, officer-in-charge of Rangpur Kotwali Police Station, said the Tawhid men had been continuing their organisational activities for 20 days from a rented house.

They distributed leaflets and jihadi books along with a daily, the "Desher Patra" among the people, he said.

One Afzal Hossain claimed that they were spreading divisive remarks about Islam through the books and leaflets.

On information about the remarks, local elite asked them to stop their activities which the Tawhid men defied, the OC said.

The clash erupted around 10:00pm when locals prohibited them from holding a meeting in the house.

During the clash, Tawhid activists attacked the locals with sharp weapons.


