

Bangladesh not ready

On March 11, 2011, an earthquake and tsunami knocked out cooling systems for the reactors at the Fukushima nuclear plant, leading to meltdowns at three of them. Bangladesh is building a 2,000 megawatt nuclear plant in Pabna with Russian assistance.

The ambassador was addressing as chief guest the launching of a book, "Climate Change and Bangladesh", in the capital's Cirdap.

The book, containing 14 articles of noted environmental experts and journalists, was published by the Centre for Development Communication (CDC) and edited by CDC Executive Director Muhammad Jahangir.

The German diplomat was also critical of coal-fired power stations which emit huge amounts of carbon. He blamed weak regulations for the excess amounts of carbon traditional brick kilns emit and for the pollution of rivers with industrial waste.

Clean energy must be promoted to prevent climate change and prevent the massive health expenses Bangladeshis incur, he said.

He suggested focusing on alternative and renewable energy sources and pointed at Bhutan, Nepal and the Maldives which were harnessing hydroelectricity.

Bangladesh also has large untapped onshore and offshore gas reserves that need to be explored, he said, emphasising on eco-friendly solar energy, of which Germany is an advocate.

Nearly 25 percent of Germany's electricity production comes from renewable energy.

He admitted that developed countries were mainly responsible for climate change but stated that developing countries like Bangladesh cannot just ignore their own responsibilities.

Journalist Mahfuzullah said while Bangladesh was a major victim of climate change, the fund meant for mitigation or adaptation to climate change was not being utilised efficiently while there were allegations of irregularities.

Dr Khaleq-uz-zaman, senior adviser for the Sustainable Energy for Development project of GLZ, a German development agency, said they were promoting a cooking stove in rural Bangladesh which can reduce fuel use by at least 50 percent and help prevent respiratory diseases like asthma.

Bangladesh Environmental Journalists Forum Chairman Quamrul Islam Chowdhury and Institute of Environment and Development Executive Director Numan Ahmed Khan spoke at the programme, moderated by Muhammad Jahangir.

Publishers trying to popularise

the 1990s, differed.
"If you want the best quality paperback then the costing would be the same as that of board binding thus making no difference in pricing," he said.

Moreover, Farid Ahmed of Somoy, which has eight science fictions of popular writer Muhammad Zafar Iqbal in paperback, contradicted Zakir's claim that paperbacks were gaining popularity among readers.

"We published four books in 2008 and four more in 2009, but did not receive the expected response from readers...They think paperbacks, which are much less in price, are not smart in appearance," he said.

Farid said he later discarded plans to bring out the rest of Zafar Iqbal's science fictions in paperbacks.

Sheikh Rafiq, proprietor of Biplobider Kotha Prokashona, disagreed. Out of the 30 books, mostly biographies of revolutionists, his publication started to churn out since 2012, 27 are paperbacks.

"These books look good in appearance and the printing are of international standard. In fact, in foreign countries, most books come in these economic paperback editions," he said.

Meanwhile, the stall of Borsha Dupur selling "120 Bhoot FM: Tero number oshoni shongket", a book on ghost stories shared in a radio programme, in the fair's Suhrawardy Udyan portion had to close down for about an hour for not being able to cope with demands.

Moreover, 160 new books arrived at the fair including journalist Mustak Ahammad's "Poribesh o Gonomadhom: Noitik Bisleshon", and publication ceremonies of 20 were held.

3 suspended BCL men still

enter the campus, let alone stay in the halls.

However, JU Law Officer Md Mahtab-Ul-Zahid told The Daily Star recently that a High Court stay order on the syndicate's decision allows the 13 to only take exams but does not clarify whether the six suspended can reside in the halls.

On the employment, JU Transport Office In-Charge Prof Khairul Bashar said Mahamudul Hasan Masud, one of the suspended, replaced his father as the office's computer operator on March 6, 2013 following the latter's sudden death.

Mahamudul was appointed on request of the JU employee's union but he will be sacked if the court finds him guilty, he added.

On making the probe report public, the law officer said they needed an HC order for it and since the trial was ongoing, they had opted for not disclosing it.

The expelled students are Khandaker Ashikul Islam alias Ashik, Khan Mohammad Rais, Zahid Hasan, Rashidul Islam, Ishtiaq Mehbub (Arup), Mahabub Akram and Najmus Sakib Topu.

The suspended are Majharul Islam, Mahamudul Hasan Masud, Kamruzzaman Sohag, Najmul Hossein Plabon, Shafiul Alam Setu and Abhinandan Kundu.

Zubair's murder was a sequel to a ragging ritual he perpetrated during his first year on campus following which he had driven out some of his alleged would be murderers from Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur

Rahman Hall in June 2010.

This was stated by a number of BCL leaders of his session and teachers of that time, but none wanted to have their names published.

On July 5, 2010, an infighting took place between supporters of the then JU unit BCL president Rashedul Islam Shafin and general secretary Nirjhar Alam Sammo over establishing supremacy in a male dormitory, leaving at least 30 BCL men injured.

That night, the BCL central executive committee dissolved the JU BCL unit and expelled 13 activists.

Immediately afterwards, SM Shamim and Sharkar Ajgar Ali of the economics department and Sheikh Shariful Islam of the history department took control of BCL politics on the campus with the "blessings" of the then vice-chancellor, Prof Shariff Enamul Kabir.

Prof Kabir had denied the allegation but Shafin, Nirjhar and the then BCL central committee president Badiuzzaman Sohag had stated it to be true.

In February 2011, the accused activists, loyal to this Shamim-Sharif group, took control over the hall and threw out Zubair, loyal to the Shafin-Nirjhar group.

Zubair's family at different times claimed that Zubair had detached himself from politics on the campus. But the enmity arising from the first year's event eventually led to Zubair's murder, stated the BCL leaders and teachers.

Former adviser to a caretaker government and former editor of The Independent Mahbubul Alam and former bureau chief of Associated Press (AP) Farid Hossain also spoke at the session, chaired by UNB Chairman Amanullah Khan.

The minister said the mass media has a historic accountability and role to help the country overcome many challenges it now faces as the country is gradually moving towards a liberal democracy free from communalism and discrimination.

"We need to do two tasks together - strengthening democracy by making politics clean, uprooting corruption and making media vibrant and transparent. Democracy can't flourish without vibrant and transparent media," he said.

Reminding the unbiased role of media, Inu said the mass media does not have any scope to make mistakes as it has a very important role in protecting democracy apart from ensuring a healthy, clean democratic practice.

"Information is not a product," he said, adding that information needs to be disseminated with accountability.

Inu urged journalists to focus on three vital issues - agriculture, ready-made garment (RMG) and remittance earners - while filing their reports. "You need to come up with success stories of these sectors. At the same time, you need to dig out the conspiracies, if any, in these sectors that might hold back their growth," he said.

Speaking as special guest, Mahbubul Alam also laid emphasis on neutrality and objectivity while filing reports. "Personal opinion and belief should not be reflected in your news stories," he told the UNB district correspondents.

UNB Chairman Amanullah Khan emphasised proper verification of information and cross-check to maintain authenticity of the contents of news and reports.

UNB Editor-in-Chief and Chief Executive Enayetullah Khan briefly talked about the history of UNB which was set up in 1988 as the first fully computerised wire service in the private sector in South Asia with AP.

He touched upon the technological revolution and massive media expansion in the country and rapid changes in the traditional media which is being gradually dominated by mobile technology with increased mobile phone penetration.

Some 70 officials and experts from over 35 governments, the European Union, United Nations, World Bank, non-government organisations, private sector entities and foundations met to review and refine GCERF's mandate and organisational structure.

The GCERF will be the first global effort to harness the skills, capabilities and resources of public and private sectors to strengthen resilience against violent extrem-

ist agendas which can significantly bar political and economic development.

It will provide grants to grassroots organisations for community-based projects on education, vocational training, civic engagement, media, and women's advocacy.

Several countries already pledged financial contributions while some multinational companies and foundations showed strong interest in contributing expertise and resources.
