Find, arrest the culprits

HC asks IGP, sees cop action against attackers of Hindus inadequate

Expressing dismay and anger over a police report on the recent attacks on religious minorities, the High Court yesterday ordered the IGP to engage the CID or other law enforcement agencies in tracing and arresting the real culprits.

While hearing a suo moto case, the court directed the authorities concerned to bring charges against the culprits under appropriate sections of laws to ensure they were punished.

The court said the Criminal Investigation Department (CID) or other law enforcement agencies will bring the perpetrators to book and the police will probe the incidents of attacks and deal with the cases filed in this connection.

The HC bench of Justice Quazi Reza-Ul Hoque and Justice ABM Altaf Hossain asked the inspector general of police (IGP) to submit a report on the attacks on religious minorities to it by April 3.

The court in its own motion on January 15 had directed the government to provide the Hindus with adequate security immediately as they are vulnerable to post-polls violence.

It also ordered the IGP to submit a report on measures taken for the protection of religious minorities and on the action against the accused.

Nahid pledges steps to recover JnU dorms

Teachers go on strike from today

Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid yesterday pledged to take steps to recover 11 dormitories, which Jagannath University (JnU) claims to have had under its control nearly three decades ago, from illegal occupation.

However, apparently unconvinced by the minister's assurance, teachers of the university have announced an indefinite strike from today with the demand for recovery of the dormitories and removal of two police officials.

Students took to the streets around 11:00am yesterday, burnt tyres and halted vehicular movement on Sadarghat-Gulistan and Babubazar-Jatrabari routes to press home their demand.

NIZAMI'S WAR CRIMES TRIAL Tribunal to rehear closing arguments

The International Crimes Tribunal-1, reconstituted on February 23, yesterday decided to rehear the closing arguments in the crimes against humanity case against Jamaat chief Motiur Rahman Nizami following the pleas for rehearing by both the prosecution and the defence.

The three-member tribunal led by Justice M Enayetur Rahim fixed March 10 for the beginning of closing arguments by the prosecution.

Justice Jahangir Hossain Selim and Justice Anwarul Haque are two other members of the tribunal.

Nizami's case was kept waiting for verdict as both the prosecution and the defence finished their arguments on November 20.

Earlier, the tribunal reheard the closing arguments in the war crimes case against Delawar Hossain Sayedee after the ICT-1 was reconstituted in December 2012.

As the court started yesterday's proceedings, conducting prosecutor

ABANDONED BOMB GOES OFF 5 children hurt

Five children, including two brothers, were injured when an abandoned crude bomb went off at a village in Bheramara upazila of Kushtia yesterday.

The children, aged between two and seven, found a ball-like object inside a rice mill at Bilshuka village around 2:30pm, witnesses said.

Taking it for a toy, as the children fiddled with it, the bomb exploded, injuring all five.

The siblings Bapi, 7, and Pappu, 2, sustained splinters in hands, neck, jaw and chest while their playmates Sakibur Rahman, 5, Sifat Hasan, 6, and Rabbi, 5, received splinters in different parts of their bodies.

The victims were rushed to Bheramara Upazila Health Complex. The brothers were later shifted to Kushtia Medical College Hospital as their condition deteriorated.

However, the duo's condition had improved and they were now out of danger, said Dr Azizunnahar, assistant director of the hospital.

Following the blast, police and the Upazila Nirbahi Officer of Bheramara visited the spot.

Describing it as a powerful crude bomb, Parvez Islam, officer-in-charge of Bheramara Police Station, said the bomb might have been thrown

Gunmen attack Thai protesters

PM flies to northern stronghold

Gunmen opened fire near several opposition protest sites in Bangkok yesterday, stoking tensions in the capital as Thailand's embattled prime minister flew to her political stronghold in the north.

A dangerous new chapter appears to have been opened in a nearly four-month political crisis that has left 22 people dead and hundreds wounded, with almost daily reports of gunshots and grenade blasts in the capital recently -- often targeting protesters.

Police said unknown gunmen fired sporadically early yesterday for around an hour in three areas of Bangkok where demonstrators are camped out alongside upscale shopping malls and luxury hotels. Nobody was wounded.

"We don't know which side fired the shots, but the aim of the gunmen is to intimidate," deputy national police spokesman Anucha Romyanan told AFP.


The spike in violence has been largely confined to areas close to the opposition rallies, which tourists have been urged to avoid, particularly after dark.

But foreigners can still be seen wandering around several protest sites, which often resemble street markets and sit next to major hotels, shopping malls and Lumpini Park.

Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra is under intense
