Dhaka's Crimea role upsets US

Bangladesh stands aloof from the tensions between two superpowers America and Russia over the "annexation of Crimea" by the latter.

Russia was quite happy as Bangladesh abstained from voting on this important issue at the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) on March 27. America, however, regretted Bangladesh's stance.

The 193-member UNGA adopted a resolution on Ukraine's territorial integrity, which called on all states, international organisations and specialised agencies not to recognise any alteration of the status of the Autonomous Republic of Crimea and the city of Sevastopol. The resolution was adopted by a vote of 100 in favour to 11 against, with 58 abstentions, including Bangladesh, India and China.

"I regret that Bangladesh was not able to join the majority on that important issue," US Ambassador in Dhaka Dan Mozena told a Meet the Press event at American Club in the capital yesterday. SEE PAGE 17 COL 1

The parliamentary standing committee on law affairs came up with the suggestion at a meeting on Sunday at the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban.


"It is the constitutional right that people will get justice within a reasonable period of time. But at present over 26 lakh cases are pending at different courts in the country.
