# 'GOODNIGHT, MALAYSIAN 370' No clue from final words

Malaysia has released a transcript of the final words spoken from the cockpit of missing Malaysia Airlines flight MH370, which contradicts earlier reports but does not indicate "anything abnormal", authorities said yesterday.

The final words heard by Kuala Lumpur air traffic control were: "Goodnight, Malaysian Three Seven Zero" and not "All right, goodnight", as previously reported, according to Malaysia's civil aviation authority. The correction is likely to anger the families of those missing, particularly in China, where there have been accusations that Malaysia has mismanaged the search and deliberately withheld information.

"We would like to confirm that the last conversation in the transcript between the air traffic controller and the cockpit is at 01:19 (Malaysian time) and is 'Goodnight, Malaysian Three Seven Zero,'" the department of civil aviation said in a statement. It did not offer any explanation as to why the incorrect final words had been allowed to circulate for weeks.

The transcript directly contradicts what Malaysia's ambassador to China told families in Beijing just a few days after the flight went missing more than three weeks ago - and which was widely circulated in the media - that the last words were a casual "All right, goodnight", indicating an unusual informality from the cockpit just minutes before its

Bangladesh finished their ICC World Twenty20 campaign without any fond memories as they suffered a seven-wicket defeat, their fourth in as many Super 10s games, against Australia at the Sher-e-Bangla national Stadium yesterday.

A slightly improved batting, courtesy of a 112-run third-wicket stand between Shakib Al Hasan and Mushfiqur Rahim, was not good enough for the home side to prove themselves as a competitive team in the shortest format of the game.

Bangladesh had crawled into the Super 10s, and not

## Dialogue a must to uphold rights

Rights violation, rule of law discussed at London seminar on Bangladesh

Voicing concern over deterioration of law and order, attacks on minorities and extrajudicial killings in Bangladesh, speakers at a London seminar have called for political dialogue to uphold human rights and democracy.

The seminar titled "Bangladesh: the way forward, peace, democracy, human rights and the rule of law" was organised by British Parliament's All Party Committee on Human Rights and held at the House of Lords on Monday.

Also focusing on war crimes trial and Jamaat-Shibir violence, the speakers said the government just cannot shrug off its responsibilities, reports our London correspondent.

Lord Avebury, vice-chairman of the committee, who chaired the seminar, said political parties have to determine in which direction Bangladesh will go.

## BAU student found dead

BCL men blamed for killing

A final year student of the fisheries faculty at Bangladesh Agricultural University (BAU) was found dead at a private clinic in Mymensingh town yesterday.

The dead is Saad Ibney Momtaj, 23, a former organising secretary of Ashrafal Haque Hall unit of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL).

Victim's friends blamed BCL men for beating Saad to death, but leaders of the pro-Awami League student body denied the accusation.

Sources said around 6:30pm on Monday, a gang of some 10 to 12 BCL activists, led by Sujoy Kumar Kundu and Rukonuzzaman Rokon, called Saad to room no 205/A of the dormitory and beat him up brutally with hockey sticks, cricket stumps and iron rods.
