A Public Works Department official was arrested over the death of a domestic help who was employed at his house in Rahmatganj area of Chittagong city.

The domestic help, Md Zakir Hossain, 12, was declared dead at Chittagong Medical College Hospital when his employers, Deputy Assistant Engineer Nowshad Zaman and his wife, brought him to the hospital.

The couple alleged that the boy committed suicide by hanging himself and they took him down and brought him to the hospital.

However, Dr Saiful Islam, who examined the body, wrote the reason of death as unknown as there were no SEE PAGE 4 COL 6

# Employer held Transport workers clash with cops

25 injured in Kishoreganj

At least 25 people, including 10 policemen, were injured in a clash between the force and workers of Ananya Paribahan at Kishoreganj bus terminal in Ghaital of Kishoreganj on Friday afternoon. Police said some plainclothes constables wanted to get on a bus

of the company without tickets but the driver did not let them in. Suddenly, several hundreds of workers blockaded the road adjacent to the bus terminal for no reason, claimed police.

However, the driver and his helper claimed that the road was blocked as the constables beat them. The clash ensued when police fired 40 blank shots to disperse them but the protesters threw brick bats at them and police, in

return, baton-charged them. Owners of some buses, including MK Super and Jatayat, claimed that police vandalised 25 buses standing at the station during the clash. But Additional Superintendent of Police, Liton Kumar Saha, denied the allegation.

Bus movement was halted on the road till filing of this report at 10:00pm.

# Transport workers block road for 4hrs

15 injured in police action

Transport workers yesterday demonstrated by blocking Dhaka-Sylhet highway at Lalabazar in Dakshin Surma upazila in Sylhet for four hours protesting an attack on a CNG-run auto-rickshaw driver.

To bring the situation under control, police fired rubber bullets and charged them with batons, injuring at least 15 of the workers.

Sylhet Metropolitan Police Additional Deputy Commissioner Mohammad Rahamat Ullah said the demonstrators set fire to tyres on the road around 9:30am, creating a traffic jam.

Over 200 workers, including auto-rickshaw drivers, joined the protest after local goons beat up driver Shafique Mia with iron rods and sticks around 7:00am at

During the investigation, police found that Nanu's gang had abducted Shafiul and confined him to a hideout in Bandar Abbas.

The gang had promised Shafiul lucrative jobs in Turkey before mobilising him to the Iranian port city from the UAE on December 28.

The CID then contacted the Iranian police to arrest the ringleader of the gang and rescue the victim, said additional DIG Shah Alam.

Binoy Krishna Mollick, executive director of Rights Jessore, an NGO, told this correspondent that he would assist Shafiul in getting back home.

Earlier, the CID had arrested 14

## 'Robber' beaten to death in Manikganj

An alleged robber was beaten to death while three others of a different gang were injured by locals in

different districts early yesterday. Locals of Manikganj's Ghior upazila said they caught and beat up Mamun Hossain, of Singair upazila, when he was fleeing with his gang from Ranjit Acharya's house at Dhulandi. He died at Manikganj Sadar Hospital.

In Moulvibazar, locals stabbed three robbers with kitchen knives while they were making off with gold jewellery worth Tk 75,000 from Waliur Rahman's house at Islamabad in Habiganj's Madhabpur upazila. Ahad Miah, Julmot Kha, and Akter

Miah are undergoing treatment at MAG Osmani Medical College Hospital. Nine others of the gang managed to flee with the same amount of jewellery.
