'An amazing journey'

The level of affection that cricket fans in general have for legends such as Mahela Jayawardene and Kumar Sangakkara could best be understood if one was at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur last night. An Indo-Lankan final would ordinarily have received roughly equal support for both sides in Dhaka, where cricket fans are partial to subcontinent sides. Yesterday however, with the exception of a large Indian contingent supporting their country, it would be fair to say that neutral support was for the

may have been the last final the two greats were playing. The respect they are held in was also obvious when Sangakkara, who along with Jayawardene, played his last T20I yesterday, entered the press conference after the triumph; he was greeted with rapturous applause by the assembled journalists.

"It's a feeling that I can't explain. It's the first time that I have been a part of a side that's won a World Cup; we have been disappointed four times before," an exhausted but relieved Sangakkara said. "You feel very humbled at the end because you realise how difficult it is to get here, how much support you need not just from your teammates, you need it from your family, your fans and all the support staff. It's been an amazing journey. Walking away, it's time. And walking away like this is even better."

The man who has always seemed to rise to the occasion, as he did last night with a nerveless unbeaten 35-ball 52 during the chase of 131, was asked whether the occasion had caused emotions to rise to the surface. "Not till the end. I am a great believer that if you get emotional you have to use it to your advantage. If not then forget about being emotional. When we had to get only 11 runs and I top-edged a boundary, seven to get... I knew it was only a couple of shots away and with Thisara [Perera] at the other end it was a done deal. That's when I thought I could show some emotion," Sangakkara said.

He was out of form during the entire tournament and since his century against India in the Asia Cup in February, had averaged 13.85 across formats. "I think what I did differently was I watched the ball a bit better today and I was a lot more positive. Usually when I went in earlier, two wickets down, I was too cautious. Trying to build a partnership rather than show a lot of intent and be positive and reverse pressure. That is something I changed today," he added.

For players like Jayawardene and Sangakkara, who had given cricket their all without much in terms of trophies in return, it may seem that vesterday's win redressed the balance. Sangakkara however was emphatic in denying that the game owed them anything. "I don't think the game owes any player anything. Our job is to try and play the best that we can and walk away hopefully having made a positive impact on the game. The game gives us the opportunities for us to try and take them. Today was an opportunity, we had "One of the things that I did quite four before this and today we took that opportunity."

I am particularly happy for the two old foxes -- Kumar Sangakkara and Mahela Javawardene. Both have served the game and their country well and it was befitting that Sangakkara came into form in the

Sri Lanka read the situation well and that helped them to make the final a one-sided affair.

Hard luck for India. They could have become the first ever team to win three titles in a row after their 2011 World Cup and last year's Champions Trophy. But it was not their day. Once again Virat Kohli was tremendous. He has been Indian batting's mainstay and showed his class once again but unfortunately other batsmen, especially Yuvraj Singh, failed to supplement Kohli. The middle overs were very miserly for India and at the death Sri Lankans bowled very well. Consider that there was no boundary in the last four overs and Kohil got to play only seven balls in those last four overs. That put paid to India's chances. I am sure Dhoni will rue why he didn't send Suresh Raina or promoted himself up the order instead of a struggling Yuvraj.

But over all it was a good tournament. It will be remembered for Sri Lanka's resilience, India's consistency, Kohli's ward to the 2015 World Cup in Australia and New Zealand.

THE FIRST TO 2000

On March 29, in the game against the Netherlands, New Zealand's Brendon McCullum became the first batsman to score 2,000 international T20 runs. He has two centuries and 13 half-centuries in T20ls, with a highest score of 123. FREAK DISMISSAL

**ORANGE RECORDS** The Netherlands broke a series of records when they chased down Ireland's 189 in 13.5 overs. They scored 91 runs in the first Powerplay, the highest ever. They also hit 19 sixes in that innings, beating Australia's 18. Unfortunately they also managed to get bundled out for just 39, against Sri Lanka -- the lowest ever T201

Alex Hales's unbeaten 116 versus Sri Lanka is the highest individual score of this World T20. The special innings helped England beat one of the favourites. Ahmed Shehzad was the tournament's only other centurion, scoring an unbeaten 111 against Bangladesh. However, Virat Kohli with no centuries tops the run-scorers' list. AVERAGE GAYLE

That Chris Gayle was not in the best of forms in this World T20 is quite obvious from his average. He scored 143 runs in five games at an average of 28.60 -- his lowest among World T20s. There have been plenty of talks regarding how spinners have

dominated the tournament. While that may be true, a majority of the wickets have been taken by pacers. Pacers had 214 scalps as opposed to the 163 taken by spinners, before the final game. TW0 5-FORS There were two five-wicket hauls taken in the tournament.
