ADP allocation gets a hike

Tk 3,210cr added for Padma bridge project

In a rare move, the government yesterday added Tk 3,210 crore to the revised ADP of the current fiscal year to make it Tk 63,210 crore, allocating the total additional amount for the Padma bridge project.

The decision was made at a joint meeting of the finance and planning ministries on the revised Annual Development Programme (ADP), said meeting sources. Finance Minister AMA Muhith was in the chair.

The allocation for the revised ADP was never hiked in the past following approval by the National Economic Council (NEC).

The NEC in a meeting on April 3 gave the nod to the Tk 60,000 crore revised ADP though the planning ministry recommended Tk 55,000 crore in line with the allocation made by the Finance Division considering revenue shortfall and low implementation of projects.

The meeting had decided that the additional Tk 5,000 crore will be allocated to ministries following consultations between the planning ministry and the finance minister.

A planning ministry official said the revised ADP figure would be included in the minutes of the NEC meeting.

Finance Minister AMA Muhith yesterday issued a strict directive that the additional Tk 3,210 crore allocated for the Padma bridge project cannot be spent in any other area even if it remains unused.

In the ADP of the current fiscal year (2013-14), the allocation for the Padma bridge project was Tk 6,852 crore. The planning ministry, however, kept aside Tk 2,600 crore for revised allocation.

LOK SABHA POLLS BEGIN

Peaceful voting on first day

India's marathon parliamentary elections -- the world's biggest democratic exercise -- began yesterday amid projections that opposition rightwing Bharatiya Janata Party would sweep back to power riding on popular anger against slow economic growth and a series of scams.

In the first phase of polling involving six Lok Sabha constituencies held yesterday, an estimated 72.5 per cent turnout of voters was recorded in five of the total of 13 seats in northeastern state of Assam and 84 percent in one of the two seats in adjacent Tripura.

Subhan, his cohorts killed 3 in Pabna

Witness tells war crimes tribunal

An eyewitness yesterday testified that Jamaat-e-Islami leader Abdus Subhan and his cohorts had stabbed the witness's three relatives to death in Ishwardi upazila of Pabna during the Liberation War in 1971.

ATM Shahidujaman Nasim, a freedom fighter of the upazila, said he had seen from a hideout that Subhan first stabbed Nasim's maternal uncle and brother-in-law, following which his cohorts hacked the duo dead.

The accomplices also killed Nasim's

nephew the same way.

First witness in Subhan's case, Nasim told the International Crimes Tribunal-2 that he had heard Subhan had the Pakistan army kill around 5,000 people in Ishwardi during the nine-month war.


The 61-year-old former student leader became emotional several times narrating the brutal killing of his relatives and the atrocities committed by the Pakistan army and their collaborators in Pabna.

One killed as train derails

10 passengers hurt

A passenger was killed and 10 others were injured as a Dhaka-bound train derailed in Chittagong yesterday.

The accident happened around 12:45pm when the last three compartments of Karnaphuli Express went off the rails at Baratakia in Mostannagar area in Mirsarai upazila, said Imtiaz MAK Bhuiyan, officer-in-charge of Mirsarai Police Station.

The dead is Nasima Akhter, 35, wife of Nazim Uddin of Ramu upazila in Cox's Bazar.

Of the injured, Md Shahed, 30, and Md Alam, 50, were admitted to Mirsarai Upazila Health Complex with fractured legs. The other wounded persons took primary treatment at different private clinics.

Mahbubul Alam, chief engineer of Bangladesh Railway (east zone), said a salvage train from Pahartali Central Workshop reached the spot and started the rescue operation in the afternoon.

Rescuers could not say how long the operation will take. The accident halted train service from Chittagong to Dhaka and Sylhet for about four hours till 5:00pm. Down SEE PAGE 11 COL 4
