

Fire originates from chemical shop in residential building

One person was killed and 10 others were injured as flammable chemicals caught fire and exploded at a shop on the ground floor of a residential building in the capital's Tejgaon yesterday.

Most of the victims were pedestrians and at least six of the injured are fighting for life with over 30 percent of their bodies burnt. Two university students and a minor boy are among the injured.

The dead is Abdul Latif, 50, a rickshaw van puller. He had been admitted to the burn unit of the Dhaka Medical College Hospital with 96 percent burns. He succumbed to his injuries around 1:00am today.

## Saad died a lonely death

None dared to help injured BAU student for fear of BCL

Saad died the kind of lonely death that happens in a society terrorised by violent politics, teachers and students of Bangladesh Agriculture University have said.

A former organising secretary of the Chhatra League's Ashraful Haque hall unit, Saad was a class representative who had unparalleled popularity on the campus.

Yet there was no one beside him for the seven hours he writhed in pain on the floor of Mymensingh district hospital's congested surgery ward. Neither his two roommates nor any of his classmates,

juniors from his department or any other friends from a university of around 5,000 students paid him a visit. This because nobody dared to be around him, given the fearsome

atmosphere the BCL men have created on the campus over the past five years, said the teachers and students. "Saad's killing is not an isolated incident. It is the result of an

uncontrolled culture of torture creating a reign of terror at the SEE PAGE 2 COL 1

## Padma issue won't affect dev projects

WB president insists ties with Bangladesh govt continues to be good

The World Bank president has vowed to continue their support to the development of Bangladesh, saying the Padma bridge issue would not have any impact on other development projects.

"Our relationship with the government of Bangladesh has

Jim Yong Kim always been good, and will continue to be good," WB President Jim Yong Kim told The Daily Star at a roundtable with reporters from developing countries at the WB headquarters in Washington DC on Wednesday.

On Padma bridge project, Kim said this was one project where the WB had trouble with and where it disagreed. "But that was just one project. We had many other projects going with the government at the same time." Also, he said, the WB was now finalising plans to sign agreements for \$2.7

billion worth of new investments in Bangladesh. "So, Bangladesh is a very important partner for us." But the stance the bank takes on showing zero tolerance for corruption is

one that it will always take, and it doesn't matter which government it is.

"And, just like in the Bangladesh case, because there has been a problem with corruption, doesn't mean that we break off the relationship," he said.

The WB scrapped its \$1.2 billion loan deal for the Padma bridge project in SEE PAGE 2 COL 1



The 63-year-old controversial BJP leader has admitted about his marital status under oath that he has a wife. At the age of 17, he married Jashodaben who almost of his age. In election papers filed on Wednesday

to run for a seat in Gujarat's Vadodara constituency, Modi wrote the name "Jashodaben" in a mandatory column regarding his marital status. He had left the column blank on previous occasions, including in the last Gujarat state election in 2012.

Jashodaben is a retired school teacher in Brahmanwada, a village about 35km from Modi's hometown, Vadnagar, and gets a monthly pension of Rs 14,000 a
