Seven fire fighting units rushed to the spot around 6:20pm and brought the flames under control after around 30 minutes.

No patients were on the tenth floor as it has been rented out to a NGO.

Meherpur farmers destroy onions protesting low price

Facing huge losses for unusually low prices, frustrated onion growers of Meherpur district staged protests yesterday by spreading several hundred kilograms of onions on the Meherpur-Mujibnagar highway in

Bamanpara and crushing those by a truck. They demanded that the government stop importing Indian onions during the harvesting time and address their plights immediately. The onion price has hit as low as Tk 10-15 a kg at farmers' level, while it should have

been around Tk 20, said the protesters. "We have been incurring heavy losses due

to the falling prices," said Abdur Razzak, a farmer of Bamanpara of Meherpur sadar upazila. "We did not expect such low prices given the experience of previous years."

Razzak cultivated onions on 26 bigahs of land investing Tk 11 lakh, he said. "I have to incur a loss of Tk 3 lakh for selling it for Tk 400-500 per maund (about 40kg)."

Another farmer, Ahsan Habib, of the same area echoed him. He cultivated onions on 32 bighas and would suffer a Tk 2.5 lakh loss if the current price exists, he said.

Onions were grown on 2,200 hectares of land in three upazilas of Meherpur this year, according to agriculture officials.
