CANCER TREATMENT AT RMCH

Malfunctioning ACs halt radiotherapy for 3 weeks

Cancer patients receiving treatment at Rajshahi Medical College Hospital (RMCH) have been suffering for the last three weeks as the hospital's cobalt therapy machine became inoperative after both of its air coolers began malfunctioning.

Dhiraj Mollik, chief medical technologist at RMCH, said one of the air conditioners of the cobalt-60 radioactive therapy broke down on March 25 and the other one broke down three days back.

After the first air cooler broke down, the

machine began malfunctioning, he said, adding that engineers from the capital arrived at the hospital the next day and repaired the machine.

Mollik further said the engineers strongly recommended running the machine at a temperature between 18°C and 20°C otherwise the machine will overheat.

However, after repairs the air conditioners have been unable to maintain a temperature below 30°C, he said.

Mollik said the Public Works Department have replaced compressors of the air coolers

comply with traffic rules for reducing gridlocks. The campaigners also took part in cleaning activities on the way.

Dr Hossain Zillur Rahman, former adviser to a caretaker government, and chief coordinator of CRI, called the campaign the first step towards building a habitable city.

A Kobi Gaan (a folk song) was also sung on DC Hill premises at the end of the march.

Road accidents kill 14, injure 35

Six die in Rangpur alone

Fourteen people were killed and 35 others injured in road accidents in the country on Friday and yesterday.

Our Rangpur correspondent reports, four people were killed and 25 others injured as a bus and a truck collided head-on on Rangpur-Dhaka highway in Angrar Bridge area of Pirganj early yesterday, said police.

The deceased were Osman, 28, Manik, 25, Nurul Islam, 35, and Momena Begum, 40, of Dimla upazila.

Eight of the injured were admitted to Rangpur Medical College Hospital while the others were taken to Pirganj Upazila

Health Complex.

Meanwhile, motorcyclists Shafikul Islam Mithu and Poncha Pado were killed and their co-rider was injured after an oncoming pickup had hit the bike at Kolabari in Pirgachha Friday night.

Injured Abdur Rashid was admitted to the hospital.

Our Gazipur correspondent reports, three teenagers were killed as a bus rammed their motorbike at Noyanpur in Sreepur yesterday.

They were Billal Hossain, son of Abul Aziz Bapari; Akber Hossain, son of Jalal Uddin; and Suman, son of Mafiz Uddin.

AL leaders trying to save accused

The attack followed a rumour announced by a mosque loudspeaker that the AL marchers killed the principal of a local madrasa in Bhujpur union of Fatikchhari.

In the four-hour mayhem, Jamaat-Shibir-Hefajat men also torched around 150 vehicles including 100 motorbikes. Five cases were filed against 16,471 people, including 471 named, mostly Jamaat-Shibir activists. Police have so far arrested 188 accused, of whom 35 are out on bail.

The AL whistleblower also said ATM Peyarul Islam, a member of Chittagong district (north) of AL, who led the Bhujpur procession, was seen in a meeting with Jamaat leader Ikbal Hossain, another accused, in Harualchhari union a few days ago.

Contacted, Peyarul said he went to Harualchhari to visit a government project

where Ikbal, as chairman of the union, was also present. "Ikbal is now on bail, and I'm not supporting him," he said. "How can I compromise with the accused when I myself could have been killed in the Bhujpur mayhem."

A Jubo League leader, who narrowly escaped death on that day, said, "I heard that some AL leaders are trying to get some of the masterminds of the mayhem discharged."

The AL insiders' claim was reinforced by Sanjida Arefin Nishu, wife of local Swechhasebak League leader Faruk Ikbal Bipul, who was killed alongside Jubo League workers Rubel and Forkan in that mayhem.

She said a few days ago, an anonymous caller offered her Tk 5 lakh so that she did not proceed with the case, which she declined instantly.

Police have not submitted any charge sheet in the cases but said they would do it soon.

Extensive security measures have been taken by the DMP including special measures to keep traffic flow uninterrupted on the streets. The following tips are provided so that the city dwellers can celebrate the day with enthusiasm and delight.

(A) Safety & Security Tips

1. Whenever police assistance is needed please contact the Police Control Room at Abdul Gani Road, Ramna Park Police Sub-control Room, Suhrawardy Uddyan Police Sub-control Room and Shahbag Police Station. For Dhanmondi area please contact Rabindra Sarabar Police Sub-control Room or Dhanmondi Police Station.
2. Please co-operate with police on security duty when they are conducting searches at the entry points.
3. If any member of your family is dislocated, please contact Police Sub-control Room immediately.
4. Advice your kids to come to police for any help. Also write your address on a slip of paper and place it into the pocket of your child.
5. Please fix a location to reunite in case you are separated from the family.
6. For your safety & security, please do not carry handbags or similar items.
7. Be sure about the price of wet rice with Hilsha (Panta-Elish) or any kind of food before eating to avoid confusion.
8. Beware of cell phone thieves and muggers.
9. Inform the police immediately, if you find any suspicious person, substances around you or within your view.
10. Honored city dwellers are requested to leave Ramna & Suhrawardy Uddyan by 18.00 O'clock on 1st of Baishakh.
11. The honored citizens are requested not to carry with them any suspicious equipment, substance, bag, knife, weapon, explosives, scissors, blade, nail cutter, matches, gas-lighters etc.
12. People are requested not to smoke in the venue or in public places.
13. If you have found anything suspicious, please inform Police Sub-control Room, & Shahbag/Dhanmondi P S.
14. Hawkers are required to enter Suhrawardy Uddyan before 4.00 O'clock in the morning.

Exit : Uttarayn (Police Bhaban Crossing, End of Minto Road), Baishakhi Gate (Opposite to Engineer's Institute).

Entrance & Exit: Shyamolima (Kakrail Mosque), Star Gate (Matsha Bhaban).

Suhrawardy Uddyan

Entrance : Engineer's Institute Gate, TSC Gate, Tin Netar Majar.

Exit : Shikha Chirontan Gate, Chobir Hat Gate (Opposite to Fine Arts), Kali Temple Gate.

(B) Instructions about movement of people & vehicles

All persons are requested to observe the following traffic instructions when attending Bengali New Year celebration venue at Ramna Park, Suhrawardy Uddyan, TSC and Shahbag.

Entrance to Ramna Park, Suhrawardy Uddyan, TSC and Shabag adjacent to New Year celebration places, the general public are requested to follow the following traffic directions from 05.00 O'clock to 21.00 O'clock.

- (1) Requested not to take any vehicle into the restricted area or safety enclosure.
- (2) Requested to park your vehicle at the designated parking place.
- (3) Requested not to stand unnecessarily on the street causing interruption to the movement of people and vehicles.
- (4) VIP, Print & Electronic Media personnel vehicles are requested to park at the instructed locations.

(C) Road Diversion

- (1) Buses from Mirpur through Farm Gate, Gulshan, Saidabad, Jatrabari will travel via the diversion route from Sonargaon left turn-Rainbow crossing Malibag or Bangla motor left turn Magbazer, Shaheed Capt. Monsur Ali Sarani to terminal.
- (2) Buses from Mohammadpur through Motijheel, Saidabad-Jatrabari-Shampur will be re-routed through a diversion route from Mohammadpur, Science Lab, New Market, Baby Ice-cream Turning, Dhakeshwari Temple, Bakshi Bazar, Chankhar Pul, Gulistan to terminal.
- (3) Buses from Tongi Airport through Gulistan Saidabad will be re-routed from Tongi, Airport, Progoti Sharonnee, left turn into Bishaw Road, Malibag Rail Crossing and then a left turn Khilgaon Fly Over-terminal.
- (4) Buses from Dhamrai, Manikganj, Gabtoli through Gulistan, Fulbaria will be re-routed through Manikganj, Dhamrai, Gabtoli Mirpur Road, Science Lab, New Market-Nilkhet Crossing, Ajampur Baby Ice-cream Turning, Sher-sha Majar left turn Dhakeshwari Temple, Bakshi Bazar, Chankhar Pul-Terminal.

4. Nilkhet Crossing to TSC Crossing;
5. Polashi turn to Doyel Courtyard Crossing through Shahid Minar;

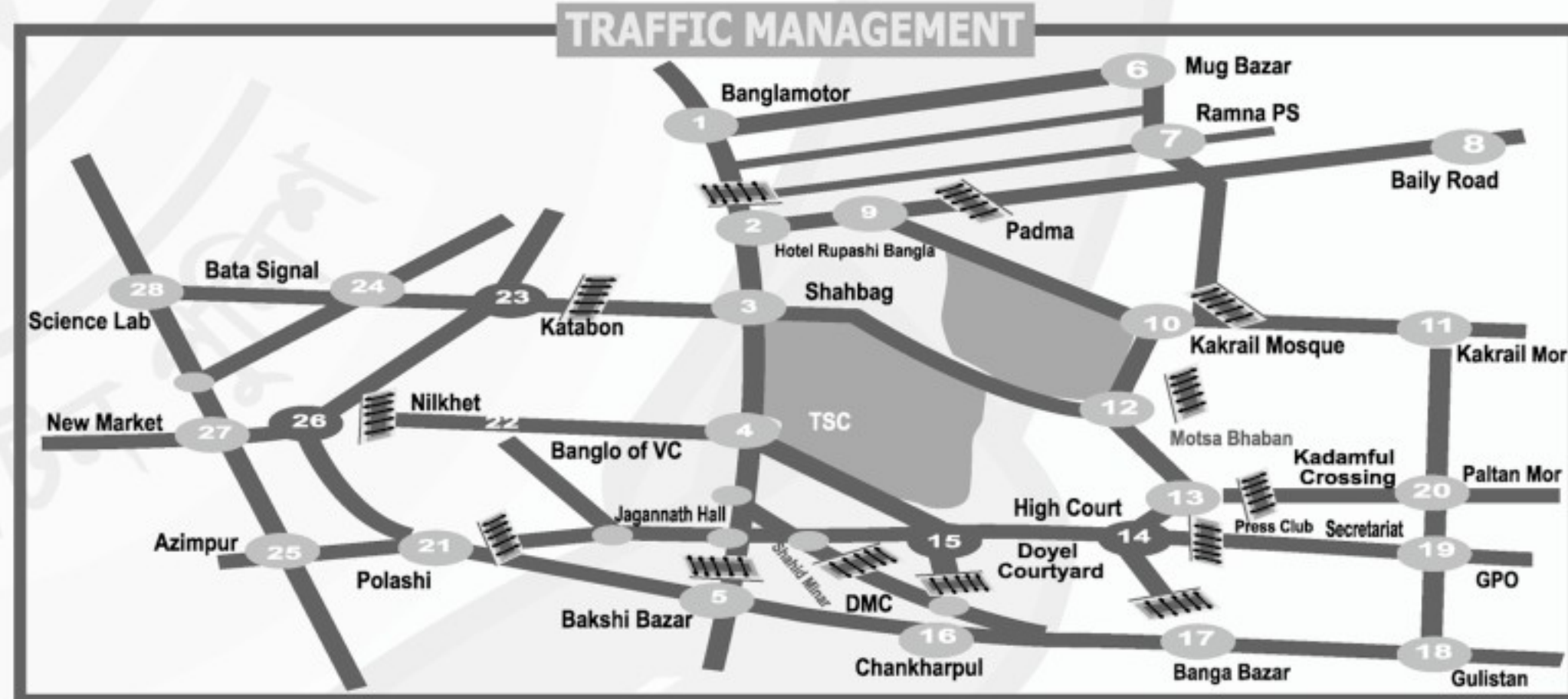
